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I. ASSESSMENT

The **purpose** of the needs assessment is to **identify and prioritize community health needs** so that the hospital can develop strategies and implementation plans that benefit the public as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable Care Act.

PURPOSE

This report summarizes the results of an assessment of the health status and unmet health care needs of residents of Main Line Health's acute care CHNA area.

- Main Line Health's acute care hospitals are located in Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties, and are a part of Main Line Health's (MLH's) network of hospitals and health centers in the Philadelphia area. The hospitals include:
 - Bryn Mawr Hospital (Montgomery County);
 - Lankenau Medical Center (Montgomery County);
 - Paoli Hospital (Chester County); and
 - Riddle Hospital (Delaware County).
- The purpose of the needs assessment is to identify and prioritize community health needs so that the hospital can develop strategies and implementation plans that benefit the public, as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable Care Act.
- The needs assessment was conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, a private non-profit public health institute.

This Assessment section includes:

- a definition of the community assessed in the report;
- a description of the previous needs assessment; and
- the qualifications of PHMC to conduct the assessment.

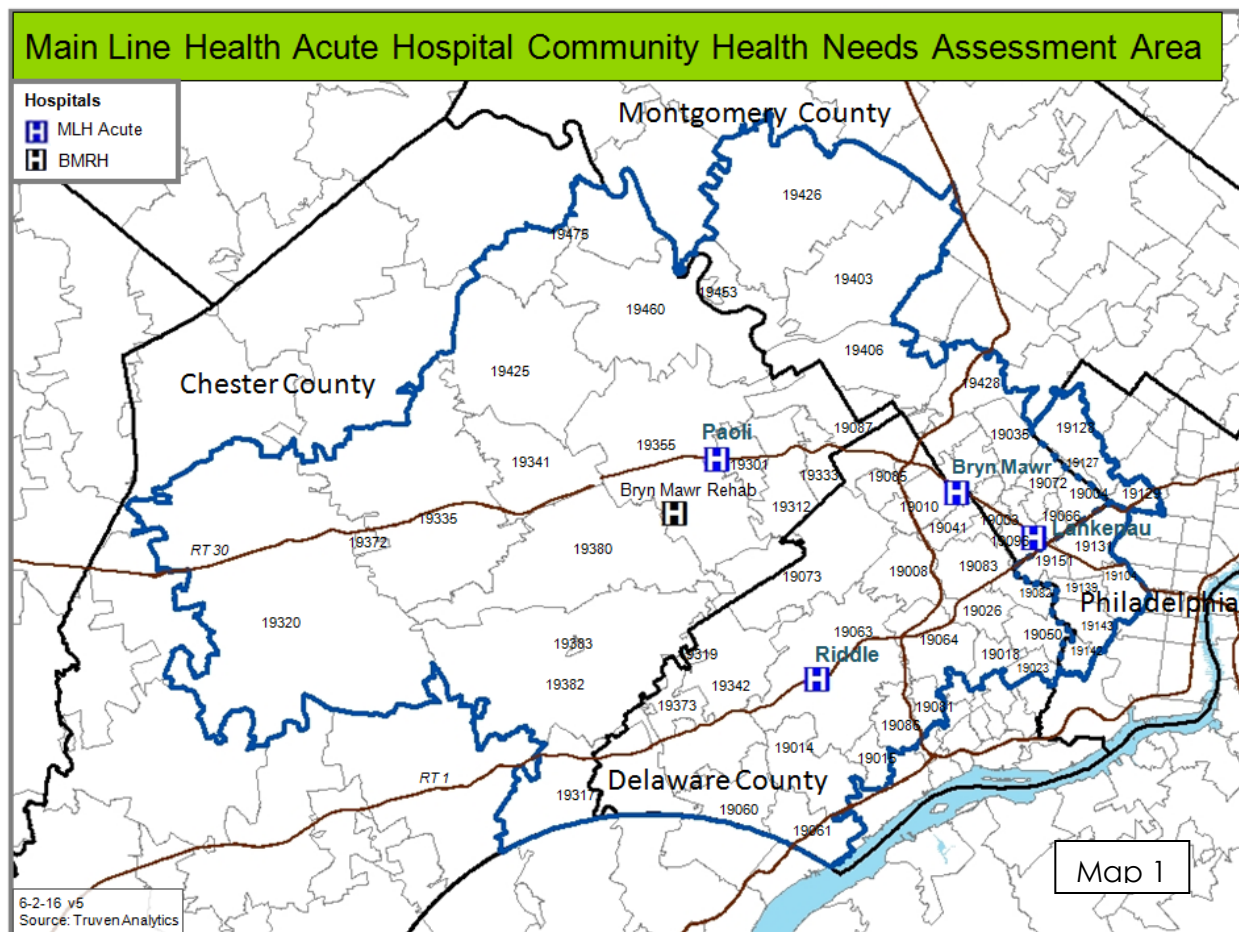

COMMUNITY DEFINITION

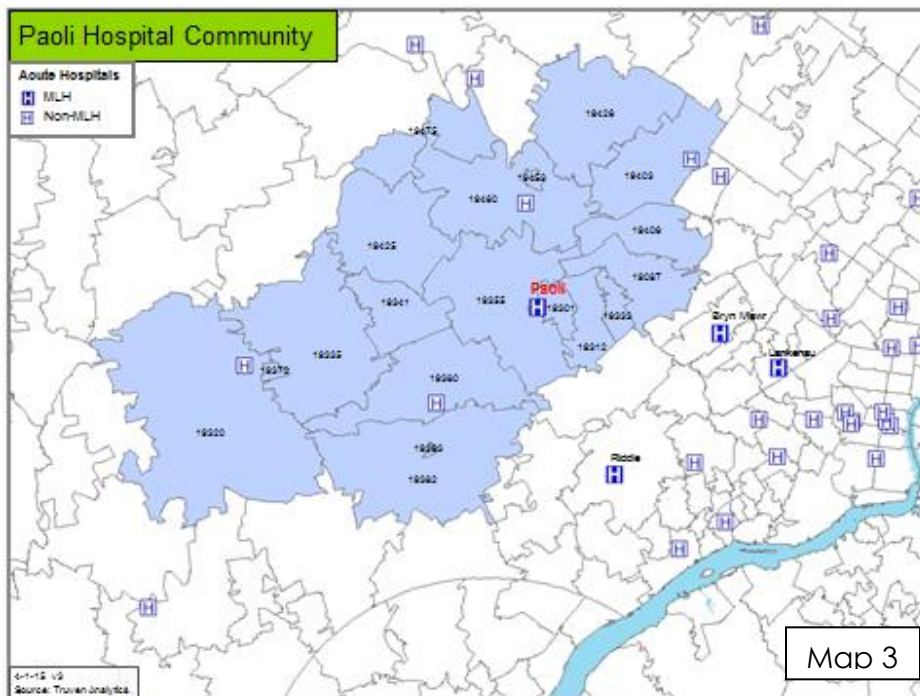
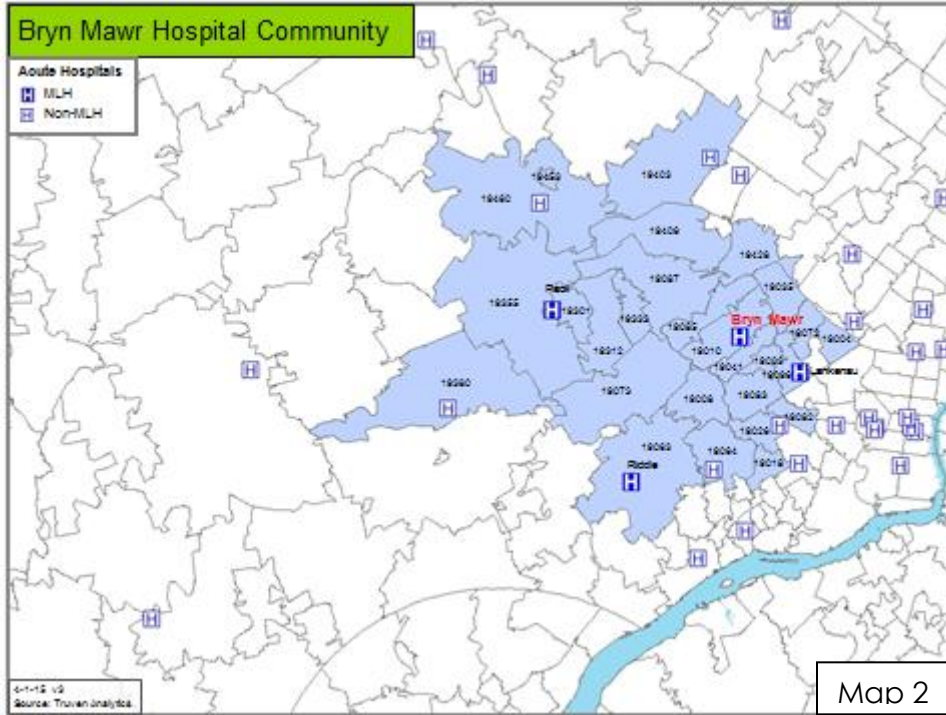
The community (2015 Pop. 1,323,650) for purposes of this needs assessment was defined as the residents of **the Zip codes where 75% of the hospitals' discharges originate.**

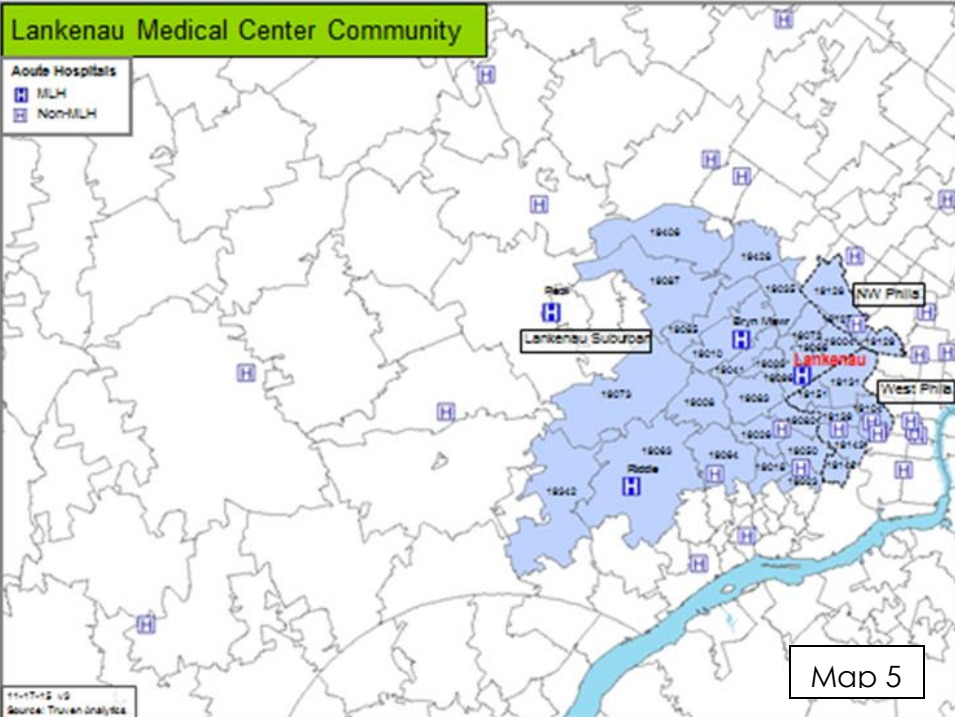
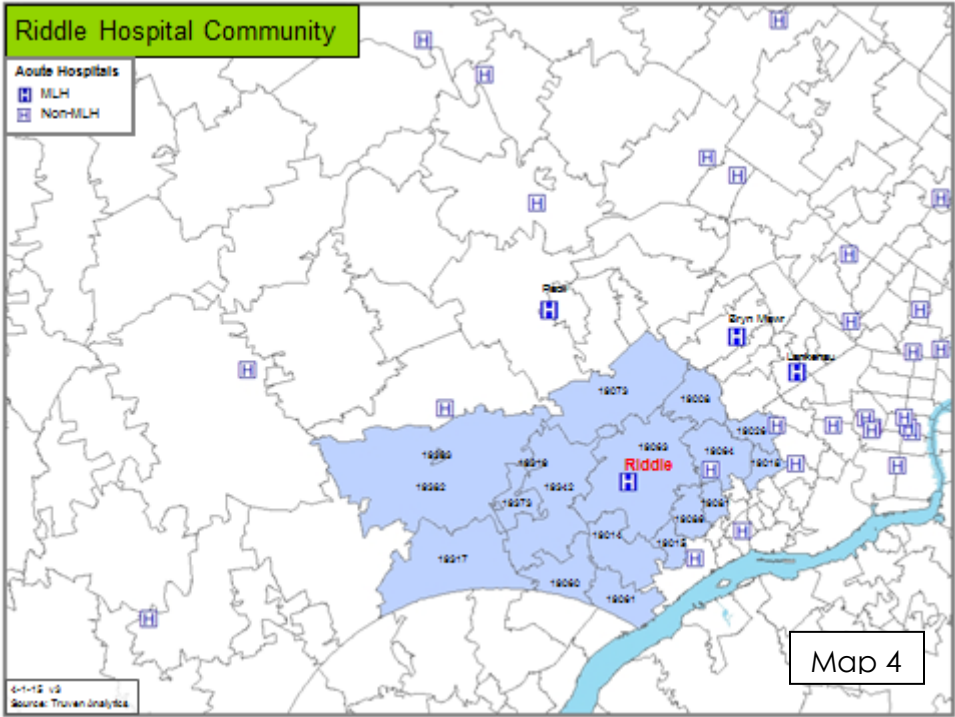
The mission of Main Line Health System and its hospitals is to provide a comprehensive range of safe, high-quality health services, complemented by related educational and research activities that meet healthcare needs and improve the quality of life in the communities it serves.

The community, for purposes of this needs assessment, was defined as the Zip codes where 75% of the hospitals' discharges originate (Map 1).

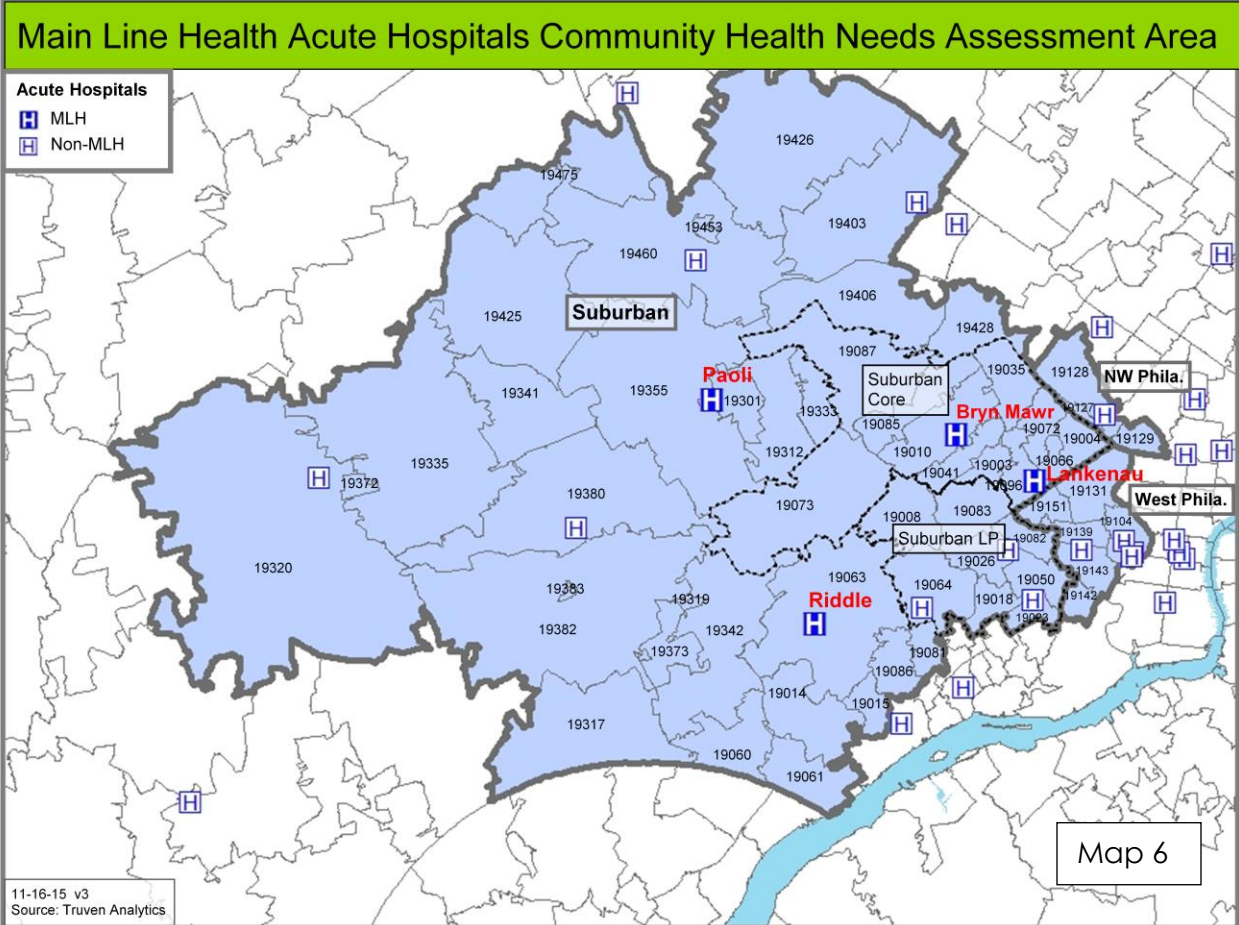


The hospital communities which make up the Main Line Health acute hospitals' CHNA area are Bryn Mawr Hospital, Paoli Hospital, Riddle Hospital, and Lankenau Medical Center. Their local Community Health Needs Assessment Areas are shown below on Maps 2, 3, 4 and 5. (See Appendix A for a listing of Zip Codes for each map.)





Also, to help Main Line Health hospitals to better understand and target the healthcare needs in its Suburban Area Zip codes, we created two data sub-areas (Suburban Core and Suburban Lawrence Park) for their use (Map 6).

This CHNA area, covering parts of four counties, is very diverse. The Main Line Health acute hospital CHNA area was divided into three sub-areas (Suburban, West

Philadelphia, and Northwest Philadelphia) to reflect the diversity within the assessment area. Additional hospital and geographic sub-areas were identified for the purpose of focusing responses to identified community needs.

- Chester and Montgomery Counties rank among the top six healthiest counties in Pennsylvania as ranked by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) supported “County Health Rankings” project (2015).
- Delaware County ranks in the RWJF top group of counties for Health Factors, but ranks 39th in Health Outcomes.
- Philadelphia County ranks 67th out of 67 counties for both rankings.

There are health care challenges in all CHNA areas of MLH hospitals. For example,

- Lankenau Medical Center serves an Orthodox Jewish population, with particular cultural needs, as well as a large economically disadvantaged population, with particular health needs;
- Paoli Hospital fulfills its mission to help those in need by working with two local community health providers;
- All hospitals serve a rapidly aging population; Riddle Hospital has seven large Continuing Care Retirement Communities (CCRCs) in its CHNA area.
- This area was chosen as the community for the purposes of this assessment because it is the source for three-quarters of MLH’s acute hospitals’ patients, and it includes populations who face economic, racial, cultural, and social barriers to health care as well as those who do not.

MAIN LINE ACUTE CARE HOSPITALS’ CHNA AREAS

In 2013, the MLH hospitals conducted separate community health needs assessments of their CHNA areas. The essential findings from those needs assessments are summarized below.

PREVIOUS NEEDS ASSESSMENT

A previous 2013 needs assessment by the acute care hospitals used data from PHMC’s 2012 Household Health Survey, the U.S. Census, PA vital statistics, and other information to identify the following priority community health needs:

- Pediatric Care;
- Uninsured;
- Overweight and Obesity;
- Cardiovascular Health / Stroke;
- Cancer;
- Lung disease;
- Senior Health;
- Behavioral Health;
- Injury Prevention;
- Dental Health;
- Asthma;
- Arthritis;
- Cost of Prescriptions; and
- Cultural/Diversity/ Disparity of Care.

These needs were identified as priorities by using the following criteria:

1. The health indicator is at lower performance than the regional, state and national benchmark, or the HP 2020 target (HP 2020);
2. The health indicator reflects a national focus for improvement;
3. There are community stakeholder interests in the health indicator; and/or
4. A special population was identified that warrants additional services.

The Main Line Health hospitals have not received any public comments since the previous CHNAs were adopted. As a result of the 2013 CHNA, the MLH Acute care hospitals had a positive impact in FY 2014 and 2015 on the specific needs identified by the needs assessment for their community, reaching approximately 68,000 lives each year, as shown in the charts below.

The following are highlights of programs made by the MLH hospitals to meet identified needs in the 2013 CHNA:

- The Community Services Departments and MLH clinical staff at the five MLH hospitals held over 2,100 CHNA Implementation Plan related events that touched over 135,500 lives during FY14 and FY15.
- Events include healthcare screenings, a variety of education presentations for school children, seniors and community residents, Cruisin' Smart automobile injury prevention events, healthcare clinic interventions, and counseling sessions.

- Over 7,000 of these touch points involved residents of West Philadelphia.

Progress in overweight and obese children (age 6+). Paoli Hospital has held over 65 presentations “promoting awareness and education on healthy eating / nutrition and promoting physical activity has reached 3,100+ persons in all age groups including parents and school age children.

The PHMC 2015 community health database indicates that the percent of overweight and obese children in Chester County declined in 2015 after years of increases.

Addressing disparities of care. Main Line Health on May 28, 2015 held its 4th annual “Healthcare Disparities Colloquium”. In 2015, there was a presentation on Disparities in Long Acting Reproductive Contraceptives (LARC); LARC is an identified priority of the Philadelphia Department of Public Health. The LMC is addressing this disparity in care in its OB Clinic by offering free LARC to qualified women.

Taking care of the uninsured. Overall the suburban zip codes in the MLH hospital's CHNA areas are affluent and generally healthy. Pockets of low income, disfranchised and under-served persons exist. Paoli Hospital has provided over \$30M in charity care and reimbursed specialists \$650K for services rendered to patients of The Phoenixville Clinic and Community Volunteers in Medicine (West Chester) in FY14 and FY15.

Innovative Community Health Partnership (LMC and The Food Trust). The Food Trust is working with Lankenau's primary and specialty physicians who serve uninsured and under-insured individuals in the Philadelphia region. The program provides eligible patients with \$6 worth of Philly Food Bucks that they can redeem for fresh fruits and vegetables at any Food Trust farmer's market. Lankenau has funded three farmer's markets. At each market, Lankenau health educators provide shoppers with free nutrition information, health screenings and family wellness activities. This program is bridging the gap between primary care and healthy food access in the community. Each Food Buck is linked to a patient so health improvement can be measured by Lankenau providers.

Primary care counseling and education related to nutrition or weight. The MLH Obesity Workgroup created and distributed a weight and wellness resource guide for MLH physicians. The guide lists resources available for patients needing guidance on healthy eating and/or weight loss.

Improving the quality of life of cancer patients (BMH priority). BMH partnered with Yellow Daffodils to offer a free Bra Fitting Clinic (March 2015) for women who have undergone breast cancer surgery. Each session space in FY15 was filled. Several participants came back to therapy.

Diversity/Cultural – a MLHS initiative. The MLHS has a system-wide initiative regarding diversity and inclusion and reducing disparities in healthcare that may exist in its CHNA areas. Cultural awareness and competence improves the quality of care and health outcomes. Each hospital has a Diversity & Inclusion Work Group that focuses on fostering diversity and inclusion across the campus. Hospitals continue to access any

needs of sub-populations in their CHNA areas. MLH sponsors an annual "Healthcare Disparities Colloquium" where research on disparities and opportunities to address them are presented to MLH employees and medical staff.

This current needs assessment of the acute care hospitals, conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, builds upon the previously identified unmet health needs using more recent data from most of the same sources to review the 2015 health needs and priorities of the community.

PUBLIC HEALTH MANAGEMENT CORPORATION QUALIFICATIONS

PHMC uses best practices **to improve community health** through direct service, partnership, innovation, policy, research, technical assistance, and a prepared workforce.

Public Health Management Corporation (PHMC) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation that was founded in 1972 to address problems in the organization and delivery of health and social services. PHMC is a public health institute that creates and sustains healthier communities and envisions a healthy community for all.

- In 2012, PHMC completed 28 Community Health Needs Assessments for Southeastern Pennsylvania non-profit hospitals, and has been assessing the health needs of the community since 1972. For a comprehensive list of completed assessments, see Appendix B.
- PHMC's Community Health Data Base is uniquely qualified to provide comprehensive CHNA services to not-for-profit hospitals. It is the only public health institute in Pennsylvania, has many years' experience collaborating with health care stakeholders, and can facilitate the participation of these diverse groups as required by the ACA.
- PHMC staff are public health experts who have conducted many CHNAs over the past twenty years for hospitals, health departments, foundations, and other non-profits.

PHMC's CHNA qualifications also include developing and maintaining the Southeastern Pennsylvania Community Health Data Base (www.CHDBdata.org).

- The CHDB provides an unmatched set of information on local community health needs that can be used to develop focused findings supported by reliable data. These data can also be used in developing priorities and rationales for strategic plans that are ACA compliant.

The biennial SEPA Household Health Survey collects information on more than 13,000 residents (children, adults, and seniors) living in the five-county SEPA region. The survey is the longest running community health survey in the United States, as well as one of the largest regional surveys of its kind.

Francine Axler and Lisa R. Kleiner are the co-directors of this Community Health Needs Assessment.

Francine Axler, Executive Director, Community Health Data Base. Since 1989, Francine has been actively involved in the field of public health and health promotion, specifically in the collection and dissemination of health status, health

behaviors, and utilization of health services data for residents of Southeastern Pennsylvania. Francine is particularly focused on teaching health and human service providers how to utilize community level health data to develop needed, effective and targeted health promotion programs for vulnerable populations. Francine directs PHMC's Community Health Data Base. She has a degree in sociology and a graduate degree in public health education.

Lisa Kleiner, Manager of Operations, Community Health Data Base. For the past twenty-eight years, Lisa has worked on a broad range of evaluation, research, and technical assistance projects. Lisa has conducted and coordinated over 50 population and community needs assessments focusing on older adults, racial/cultural minorities, persons with behavioral health needs, homeless families, maternal and child health and other at-risk groups and communities. In addition to this expertise, Lisa has provided training and technical assistance to over 200 organizations to enable them to build their capacity to define and measure program outcomes and impact, tailoring the technical assistance to the specific needs of the organization and staff. Lisa has a law degree and a graduate degree in social work.

II. PROCESS AND METHODS

The five steps in the needs assessment process were:

1. defining the community;
2. identifying existing primary and secondary data and data needs;
3. collecting primary and secondary data;
4. analyzing data; and
5. preparing a written narrative report.

Additional hospital and geographic specific data are supplied in the Appendices to allow the Main Line Health hospitals to further target community health needs. The data acquisition and analysis, community representatives, and information gaps are described in more detail below.

DATA ACQUISITION AND ANALYSIS

Both primary and secondary and quantitative and qualitative data were obtained and analyzed for this needs assessment.

- Obtaining information from multiple sources, known as triangulation, helps provide context for information and allows researchers to identify results which are consistent across more than one data source.

Quantitative information from:

- the 2013 American Community Survey, and 2015 and 2020 Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts;
- Pennsylvania Health Department vital statistics on births, deaths, communicable diseases, and cancer incidence (2008-2012 and 2009-2012);
- PHMC's 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey;
- a 2015 mail survey of school nurses in SEPA (n=31); and
- a 2015 electronic mail survey of MLH physicians (n=45)

was analyzed for the hospitals' CHNA area using the Statistical Program for Social Sciences (SPSS).

Frequency distributions were produced for variables for multiple years of data so trends over time could be identified and described. In addition, for Household Health Survey measures, tests of significance were conducted comparing the CHNA area to the HHS for Southeastern Pennsylvania to objectively identify and prioritize unmet needs.

In addition, quantitative data for each CHNA area from the HHS was compared to health objectives for the United States from HP 2020, and to data collected for Pennsylvania from the Center for Communicable Diseases' 2014 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey.

Qualitative information. PHMC also collaborated with MLH and BMRH to identify individuals living and/or working in the communities in the hospital's CHNA areas who could provide input on the needs assessment as community members, public health experts, and as leaders or persons with knowledge of underserved racial minorities, low income residents, and/or the chronically ill. The hospital, MLH, and PHMC worked together to obtain meeting venues, contact potential participants, and encourage attendance.

- Meeting participants were not compensated.
- Participants who could not attend were invited to send written comments, and these were incorporated into the report.
- Input from the community meeting participants, including county and local health department officials and public health experts, was used to further identify and prioritize unmet needs, local problems with access to care, and populations with special health care needs.

Qualitative information from the community meetings was analyzed by identifying and coding themes common to participants, and also themes that were unique.

- This information was organized into major topic areas related to health status, access to care, special populations, and unmet needs.

In addition, informational interviews were conducted with school officials involved in the Cruisin' Smart safe driving program sponsored by MLH, BMRH, and State Farm Insurance Company.

The information from this needs assessment will be used by the acute care hospitals to develop a community health implementation plan. Where appropriate, they will collaborate with other MLH entities, local health departments, and other community resources to meet priority needs. (See Appendix H for a list of Community Resources.)

These sources are described in more detail in the next section.

PHMC SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA HOUSEHOLD HEALTH SURVEY

A total of 3,343 interviews were conducted with adults residing in the MLH acute care hospitals CHNA area, These include 2,493 in the Suburban sub-area, 142 in the NW Philadelphia sub-area and 708 in the West Philadelphia sub-area

The 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey questionnaire examines health status and utilization of, and access to, health care among adults and children in the five-county area of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties.

- The survey was conducted through telephone interviews with people 18 years of age and older living in 10,018 households in Southeastern Pennsylvania.
- A total of 2,009 cell phone interviews were conducted with adults in the five county area. Cell phone respondents received the same survey questionnaire as landline respondents.

The survey includes many questions that have been administered and tested in national and local health surveys:

- National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) for the National Health Interview Survey (NHIS);
- The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS);
- The California Women's Health Survey;
- The Social Capital Community Benchmark Survey (Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University); and
- The Survey on Childhood Obesity (Kaiser Family Foundation/San Jose Mercury News).

Households in each of the five counties were selected to guarantee representation from all geographic areas and from all population subgroups. When needed, the interviews were conducted in Spanish.

The survey was administered for PHMC by Abt/SRBI, Inc., a research firm in New York City, between December 2014 and March 2015.

The final sample of interviews is representative of the population in each of the five counties so that the results can be generalized to the populations of these counties.

Within each selected household with more than one eligible adult, the Last Birthday Method was used to select the adult who last had a birthday as the respondent for the interview (with the exception of the cell phone sample).

- In households with children, the child under age 18 who most recently had a birthday was selected as the subject of the child interview.
- The survey incorporates over-samples of people ages 60-74 and 75 and older to provide a sufficient number of interviews for separate analyses of the responses of people in these subgroups.

U.S. CENSUS

This report includes data on the characteristics of the hospitals' CHNA area residents, and residents of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery, and Philadelphia Counties for the years 2013, 2015 and 2020. Data from the 2010 U.S. Census, estimates from the 2013 and 2015 American Community Survey, and the Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database projections for 2020 were also used. The Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database uses an internal methodology to calculate and project socio-demographic and socioeconomic characteristics for non-census years, relying on the U.S. Census, the Current Population Survey, and the American Community Survey.

VITAL STATISTICS

The most recent information on births, birth outcomes, deaths, cancer, and reportable diseases and conditions for residents of the hospitals' CHNA areas and Southeastern Pennsylvania was obtained from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Bureau of Health Statistics and Research.

- Five year (2009-2012) annualized average rates for natality and four year (2008-2012) annualized average rates for mortality and cancer incidence were calculated by PHMC.
- Mortality rates were age-adjusted using the Direct Method and the 2000 U.S. standard million population.

The most recent (2014) morbidity information and on rates of cancer incidence for 2008-2012 was also obtained from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, and rates were calculated by PHMC.

The denominators for all 2008-2012 and 2009-2012 vital statistics rates for the county and state were interpolated from the 2010 U.S. Census and the 2015 American Community Survey. The number of women ages 15-44 and ages 15-17 were also interpolated from the 2010 US Census and 2015 American Community Survey.

OTHER SURVEYS

This report also analyzes information from a mail survey of 31 nurses in schools located in MLH's CHNA area conducted by PHMC in June 2015, and an electronic survey of 45 MLH physicians that was conducted by MLH in June 2015. Please see Appendix H for a list of major topic areas).

COMMUNITY MEETINGS AND INTERVIEWS

The MLH acute care hospitals consulted with 53 community members in six separate meetings to gain input for identifying community health needs, determine which were most significant, and prioritize them. These community members included local government, public health experts, and members and representatives of medically underserved, low-income, and minority populations. Participants to the meetings were identified by MLH staff working with PHMC, and invited by mail or electronic mail to attend a meeting for one of the counties in the MLH acute care CHNA area. MLH also consulted individually with members of local health departments (Philadelphia, Montgomery, and Chester Counties). Community representatives included the following agencies who serve the medically underserved and low income and minority populations.

Meetings were held between June and September, 2015. The meetings were guided by a set of written questions that focused on participants' perceptions of the most important physical and behavioral health problems in the area, programs that successfully address these issues, gaps in services, barriers to care, vulnerable and underserved populations, and how to best reach individuals in the community. The input from these meetings is summarized in each section of this report, as pertinent.

INFORMATION GAPS

Quantitative information for socioeconomic and demographic information, vital statistics, and health data was available at the ZIP code level for the CHNA area. To fill potential gaps in information, these data were supplemented by detailed information about the CHNA area obtained from community meetings.

III. COMMUNITY DEMOGRAPHICS

This report includes a description of the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the residents of the CHNA area, because these characteristics are strong indicators of access to health care and good health. (For U.S. Census Tables, please see Appendix C).

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

POPULATION SIZE

The population of all MLH CHNA areas increased slightly between 2000 and 2015, and all are projected to continue to increase slightly through 2020.

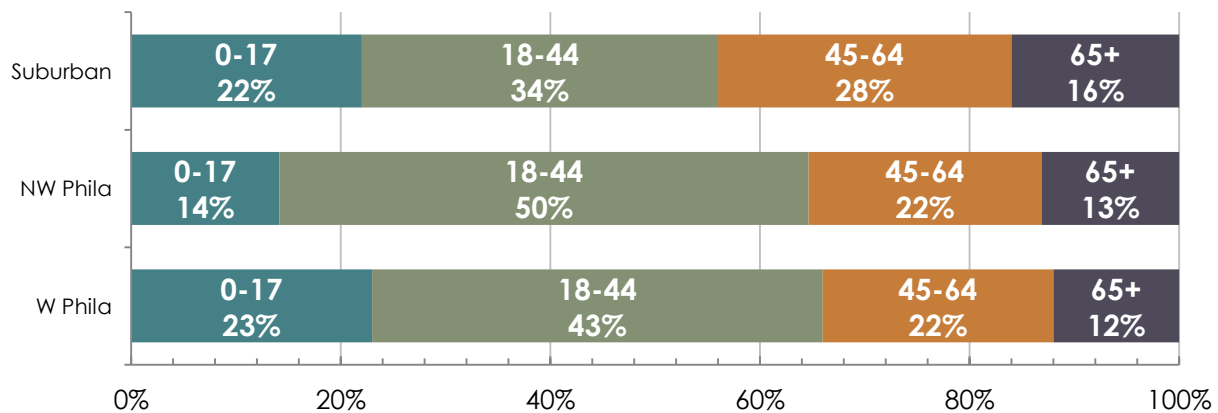
- The suburban CHNA area's population was about 1,006,000 in 2015. This represents a slight population increase from 987,800 in 2010. The suburban CHNA area population is projected to increase slightly to about 1,023,400 by 2020.
- The West Philadelphia CHNA area's population is 264,700. The population increased by only 3,600 persons from 261,100 in 2010. By 2020, the West Philadelphia area's population is projected to be about 268,000.
- The Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area has a population of 53,000, a slight increase from 52,000 in 2010. By 2020, the population is projected to be 53,800.

AGE

In the suburban CHNA area, 16% of residents are age 65 or older. This area has the highest percentage of older adults among the three CHNA areas. The percentage of older adults is projected to increase to 18% by 2020.

- In addition, 22% of suburban CHNA area residents are children between the ages of 0-17.
 - One-third of residents (34%) are 18-44 and 28% are 45-64.

Figure 1. Age Distribution of the Population by CHNA Areas, 2015



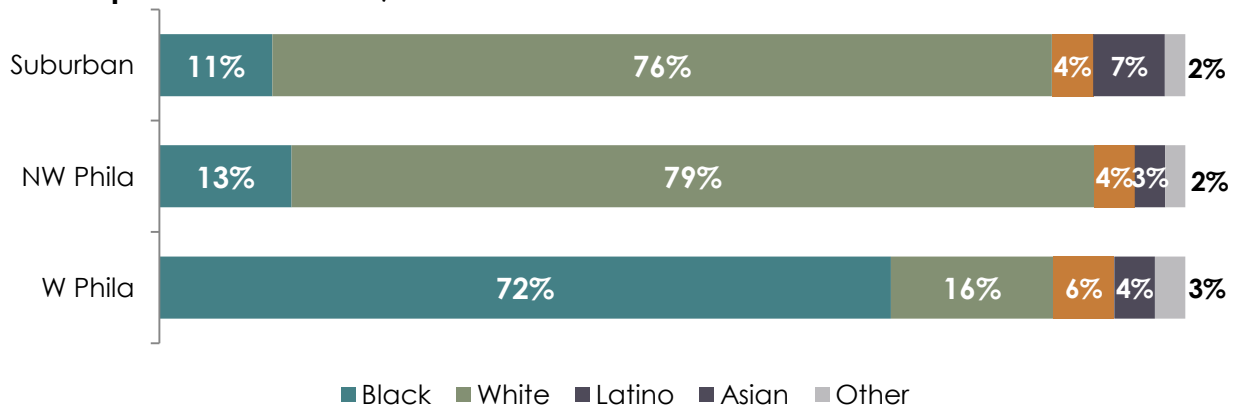

- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, the population is younger than the suburban CHNA population: nearly one-quarter of the residents (23%) are children between the ages of 0-17 and only 12% are 65 or older.
 - Forty-three percent are 18-44 and 22% are 45-64.
- The Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area has the smallest percentage of children among the three CHNA areas: only 14%.
 - A majority of residents (50%) are 18-44, 22% are 45-64, and 13% are age 65 or older.

RACE/ETHNICITY

Over three-quarters of suburban CHNA area residents (76%) are White, and one in nine are Black (11%). Thirteen percent of residents are Asian (7%), Latino (4%), or an “other” race/ethnicity (2%).

- The percentage of residents who identified as non-White in the suburban CHNA area increased between 2010 and 2015: these changes are projected to continue through 2020.
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, nearly three-quarters of residents (72%) are Black, 16% are White. Twelve percent are Asian (6%), Latino (4%) or an “other” race/ethnicity (3%).
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, the percentage of residents who are Black decreased slightly between 2010 (74%) and 2015 (72%), and is projected to be 70% by 2020.
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, more than three-quarters of the residents (79%) are White, and 13% are Black. Nine percent are either Asian (3%) Latino (4%) or an “other” race/ethnicity (2%).
- In the suburban and Northwest Philadelphia CHNA areas, 4.3% of the population of each area is Jewish, representing about 31,000 persons in the suburban CHNA area and 1,700 in the NW CHNA area. A sub-group of the Jewish faith identify as Orthodox Jews. This population may have special cultural needs when seeking healthcare.

LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

The overwhelming majority of residents in all of the MLH CHNA areas (88% to 90%) speak English at home.

- In the suburban CHNA area, 88% speak English at home, 3% speak an Asian language, 3% speak Spanish, and 6% speak another language.
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, 88% speak English, 3% speak an Asian language, 4% speak Spanish, and 6% speak another language.
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, 90% speak English, 2% speak an Asian language, 3% speak Spanish, and 4% speak another language.

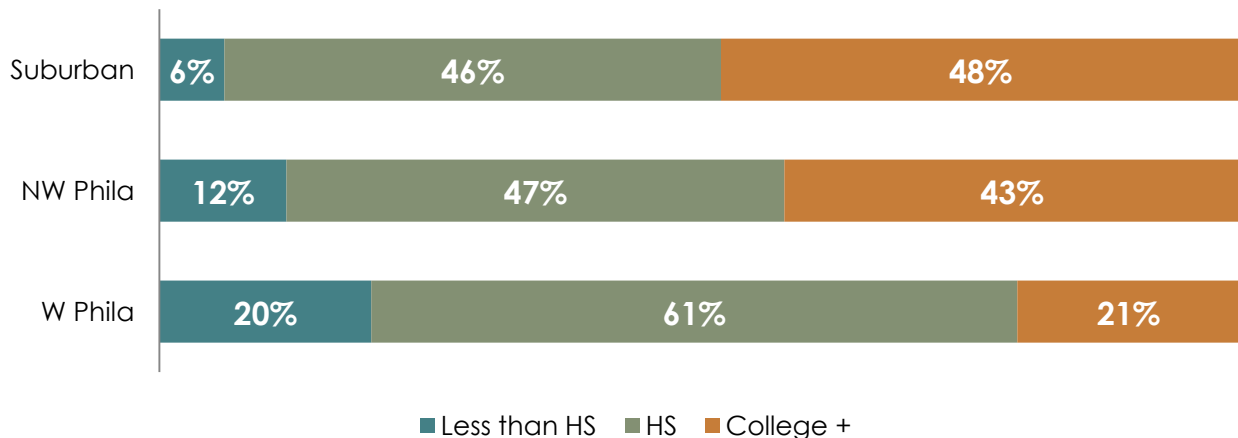
SOCIOECONOMIC INDICATORS

EDUCATION

The level of educational attainment of residents varies widely by CHNA area: Suburban CHNA area residents age 25 and over are the most likely to hold a college degree or more, followed by Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area adults. West Philadelphia CHNA area adults are most likely (20%) to have dropped out of high school.

- In the suburban CHNA area, nearly one-half of residents age 25 and over (48%) have a college degree or more, 46% graduated from high school, and 6% did not graduate from high school.
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, 21% of residents age 25 and over have a college degree or more, 61% graduated from high school, and one in five did not earn a high school diploma.
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, 43% of adults age 25 and over has a college degree or more, nearly one-half of residents (47%) graduated from high school, and 12% did not graduate from high school.
- The educational attainment of residents in the CHNA areas has remained fairly stable over time, and is projected to remain similar to the current levels through 2020.

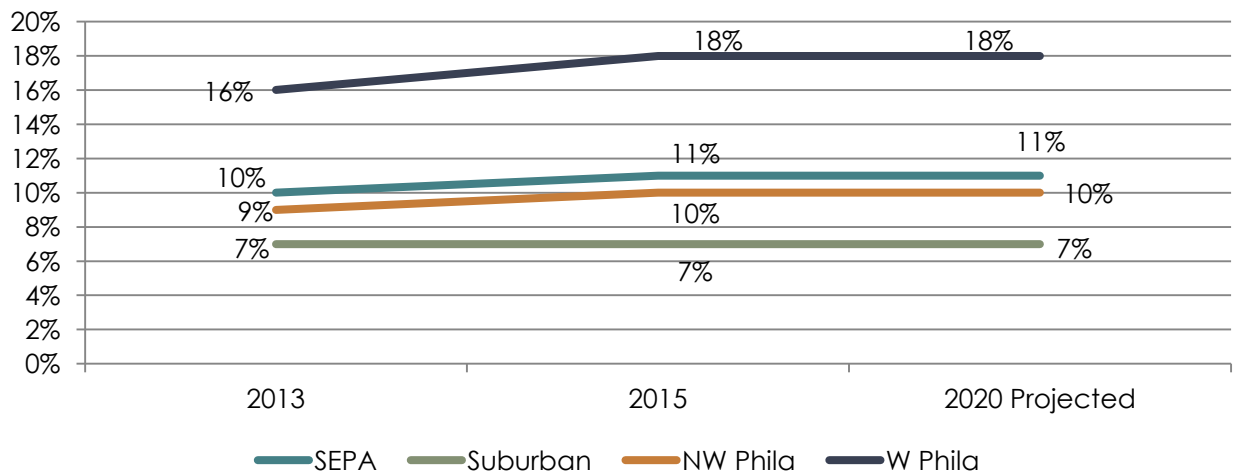
EMPLOYMENT

The overwhelming majority of residents in all three CHNA areas are employed. However, unemployment is highest in West Philadelphia and lowest in the Suburban CHNA area.

- In the suburban CHNA area, 7% of the work force is unemployed.
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, 18% of the work force is unemployed.
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, 10% of the work force is unemployed.

In SEPA as a whole, 10% are unemployed. The proportion of the population unemployed in both SEPA overall and the West and Northwest Philadelphia CHNA areas is projected to increase slightly by 2020.

Figure 4. Unemployment by CHNA Areas, 2013, 2015, and 2020



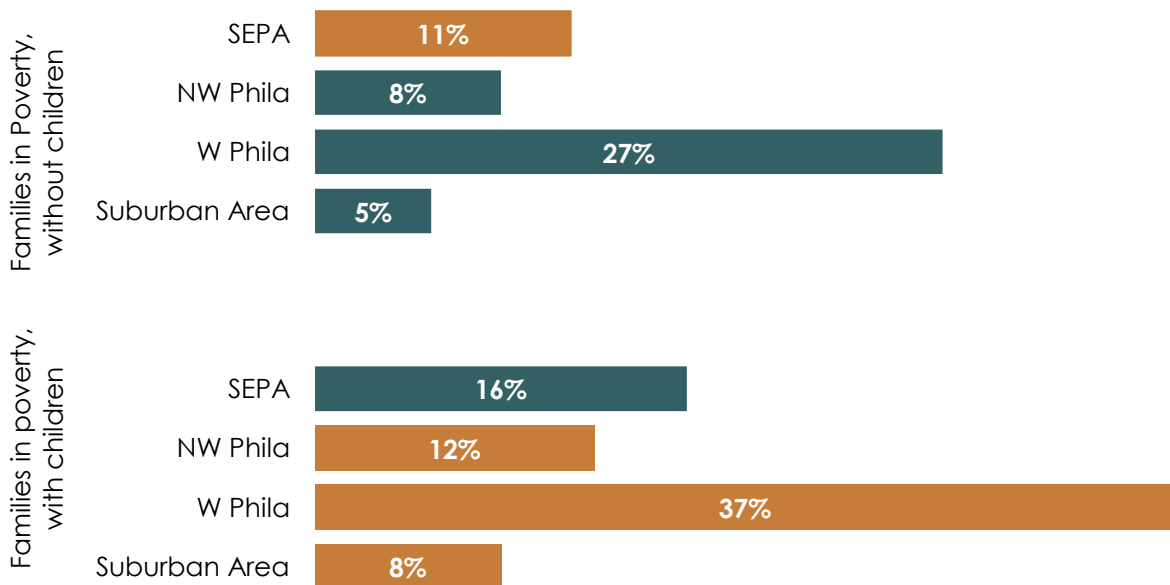

POVERTY STATUS

Poverty also varies widely between CHNA areas, with the West Philadelphia CHNA area having the highest rate of poverty among the three CHNA areas.

- In the suburban CHNA area, fewer than one in ten families with children (8%) and one in twenty families without children (5%) is living in poverty.
- In contrast to the suburban CHNA area, in the West Philadelphia CHNA area more than one-third of families with children are more than four times more likely (37%) to live in poverty than families in the suburban CHNA area (8%).
 - Families without children in the West Philadelphia CHNA area are more than five times more likely (27%) to live in poverty than families in the suburban CHNA (5%).
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, 12% of families with children and 8% of families without children are living in poverty.
- The poverty level in all three CHNA areas has remained stable over time and not much change is projected by 2020.

Figure 5. Families in Poverty by CHNA Area, 2015



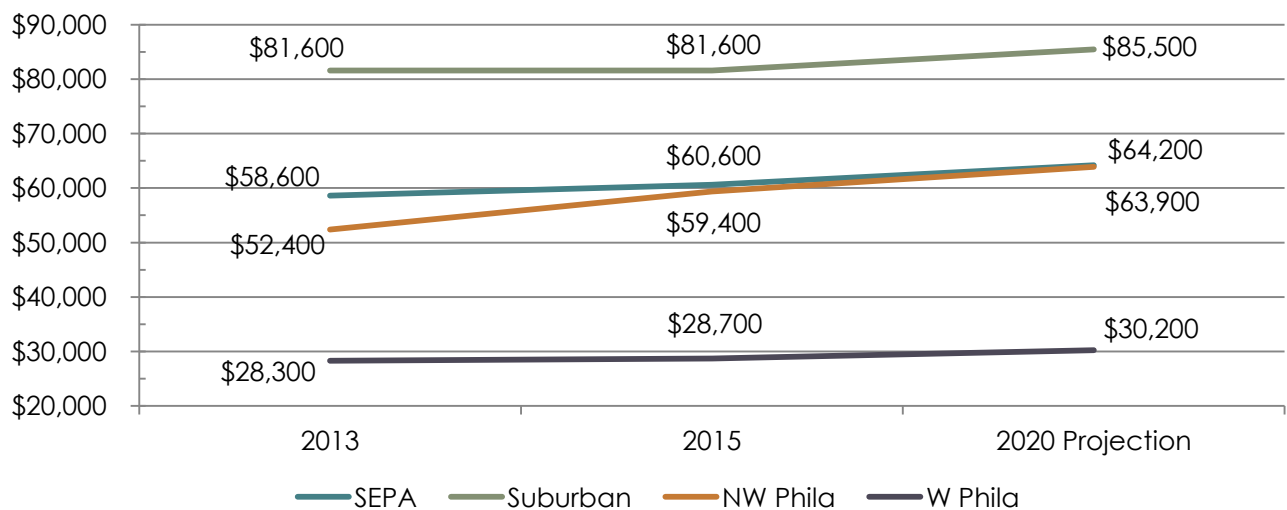

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Median household income in the CHNA areas also varies considerably, from a high of over \$81,000 annually in the Suburban CHNA area to a low of nearly \$29,000 annually in West Philadelphia.

- In the suburban CHNA area, the median household income is projected to increase to \$85,500 in 2020
- In the West Philadelphia CHNA area, the median household income has not varied over the past few years. In 2015, it was \$28,700, and it is projected to increase only \$1,500 by 2020.
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, the median household income is increasing. In 2015 it was \$59,400, an increase from \$53,700 in 2010, and it is projected to increase further to \$63,900 in 2020.

Figure 6. Median Household Income by CHNA Areas 2013, 2015, and 2020.



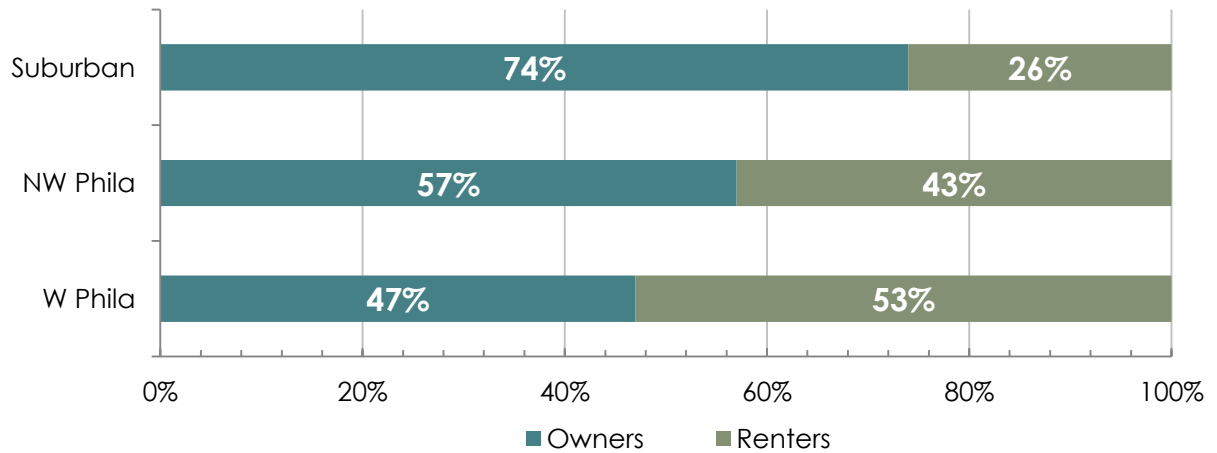

HOME OWNERSHIP

Home ownership is most common in the suburban CHNA area: nearly three-quarters of residents (74%) own their own home.

- In contrast to the suburban CHNA area, in the West Philadelphia CHNA area, a majority of residents are renters (53%).
- In the Northwest Philadelphia CHNA area, a majority of residents (57%) own their home, and 43% of residents rent their home.

IV. FINDINGS

HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY

The health of a community can be assessed by comparing birth outcomes, self-reported health status and health conditions, communicable disease rates, self-reported health concerns and perceptions, and mortality rates to statewide indicators and HP 2020 goals for the nation. This section examines information for MLH's acute care hospital's suburban CHNA area compared to its CHNA areas in West and Northwest Philadelphia.

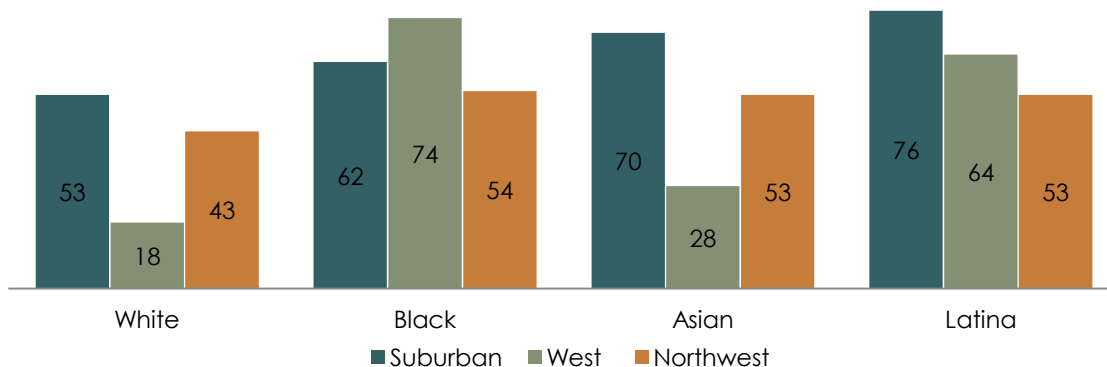
BIRTH OUTCOMES

Birth outcomes for residents of the CHNA area generally **meet the HP 2020 goals** for the nation, except for Black births.

FERTILITY RATES

There are more than 11,000 births annually to women living in the MLH suburban CHNA area (See Appendix D for the Vital Statistics Tables). This represents a birth rate of 57 per 1,000 women age 15-44.

Figure 8. Fertility Rates for Women 18-44, 2009-2012

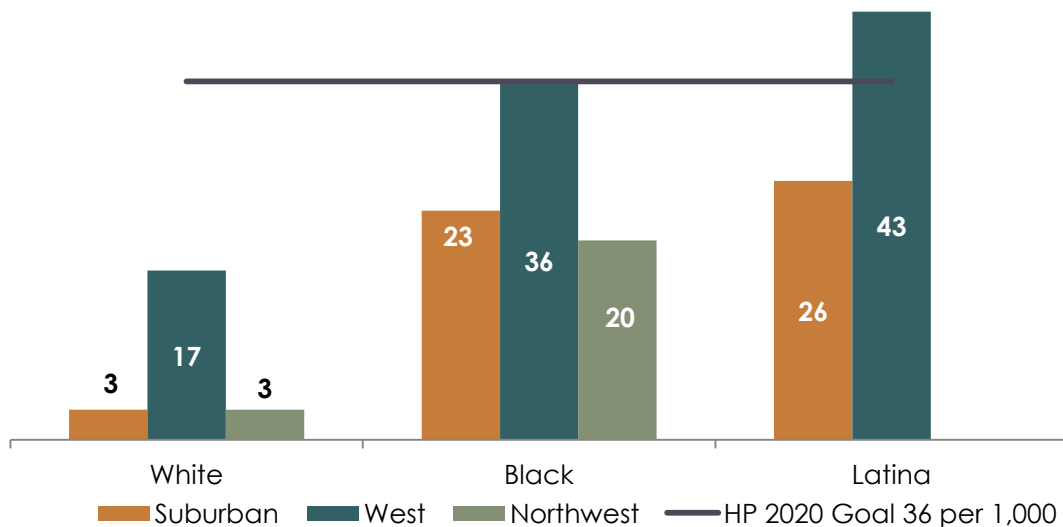

- The fertility rate in West Philadelphia (59) is the highest birth rate among women in all MLH acute care hospital CHNA areas. Conversely, the Northwest Philadelphia fertility rate (45) is lowest among all the MLH CHNA areas.
- Latina women in the suburban CHNA area have the highest fertility rate (76 per 1,000; representing 600 births annually) in the suburban CHNA area among different racial and ethnic groups, while White women have the lowest fertility rates (53 per 1,000; representing 7,700 births annually) (Figure 8).
- Black (74) and Latina (64) women have the highest fertility rate in West Philadelphia, compared to White and Asian women in that area, who have fertility rates of 18 and 28 per 1,000, respectively.

Infants born to teenagers have been associated with a number of negative birth outcomes, including prematurity and low birth weight, making it an important outcome to track.

The fertility rate for adolescents ages 15-17 living in the suburban CHNA area is 6 per 1,000 (Figure x). This represents 130 births annually.

- The suburban CHNA area meets the HP 2020 goal for births to adolescents age 15-17, which is 36 per 1,000.

- Latina adolescents (26 per 1,000) have the highest fertility rate among adolescents in the suburban CHNA area, and white adolescents (3 per 1,000) have the lowest rate.
- The adolescent fertility rate for Latinas in West Philadelphia (43) does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 36 per 1,000.

West Philadelphia has the highest adolescent fertility rate (36) among all MLH acute care CHNA areas; the Bryn Mawr Hospital CHNA area has the lowest (4).

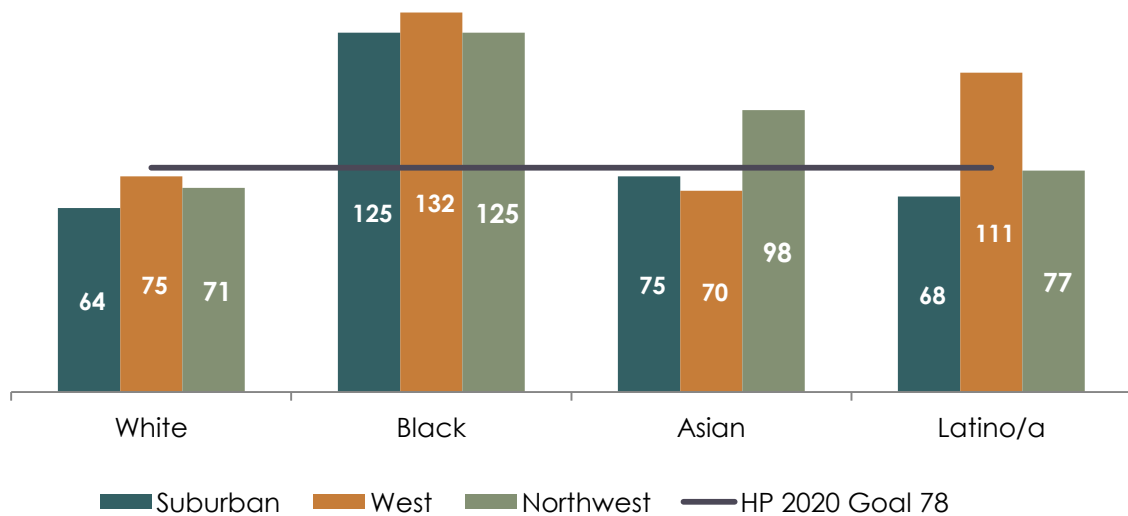
- The adolescent fertility rate in Northwest Philadelphia is 7 per 1,000; this represents 5 births annually.

LOW BIRTH WEIGHT

Low birth weight infants (<2,500 grams or 5lb 8 oz) are at greater risk for dying within the first year of life than infants of normal birth weight.

In the suburban CHNA area, 75 infants per 1,000 live births are low birth weight. This rate has met the HP 2020 target goal (78 per 1,000) (Figure 10).

- there are an average of 800 low birth weight births every year in the suburban CHNA area.

- Black infants in the CHNA area are twice as likely to be low birth weight as White infants (125 versus 64).
- The low birthweight rate for Black infants in all three CHNA areas does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 78 per 1,000.

West Philadelphia has the highest low birth weight rate (126) among all MLH acute care CHNA areas; this represents 500 low birth weight infants.

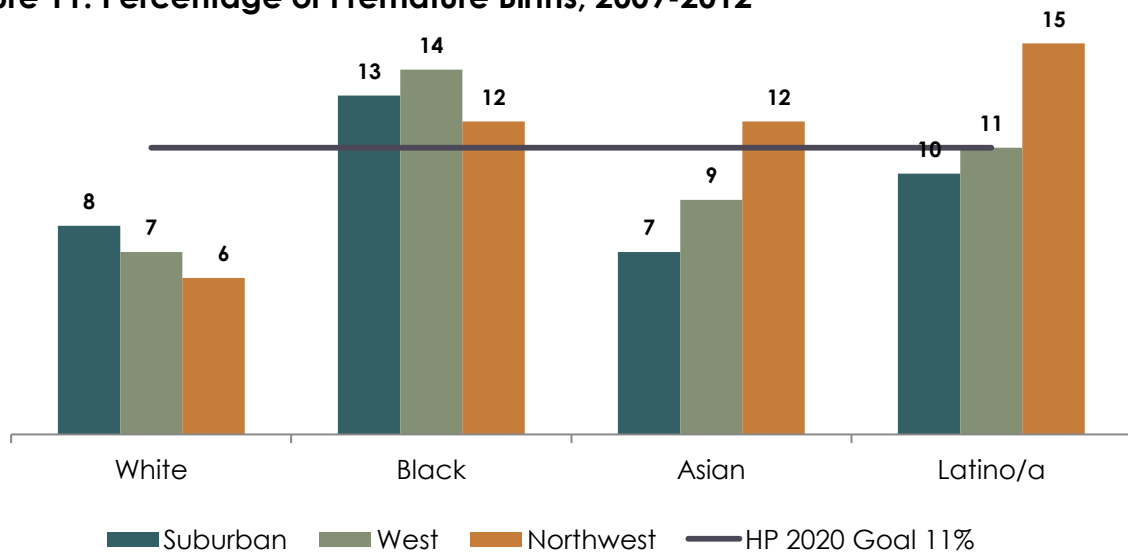
- The low birthweight rate in Northwest Philadelphia is 79, representing 51 births annually.

PREMATURE BIRTHS

There are an average of 990 premature births (less than 37 weeks gestation) to women living in the suburban CHNA area, representing 9% of all live births.

- In Northwest Philadelphia, 9% of all live births are premature, representing 57 infants.

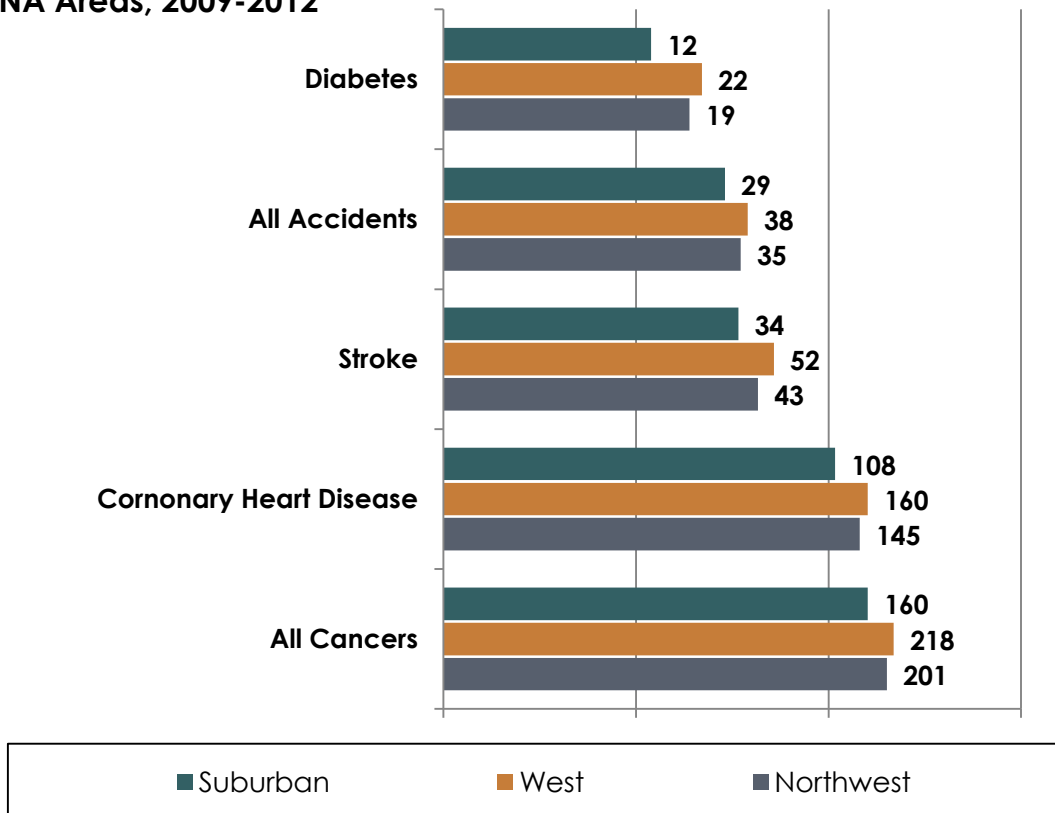
MORTALITY

Mortality rates in the CHNA area are **lower than SEPA** overall.

OVERALL MORTALITY

The overall mortality rate in the suburban CHNA area is 631 deaths per 100,000 population (Figure 12).

Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the suburban CHNA area (108; representing 1,300 deaths). This does not meet the HP2020 goal of 103.

- The other four leading causes of death in the suburban CHNA area are lung cancer (42; representing 500 deaths), stroke (34; 430), accidents (29; 310), and female breast cancer (23; 150).

- Diabetes is responsible for 140 deaths in the suburban CHNA area annually, or 12 deaths per 100,000.

West (898 per 100,000) and Northwest Philadelphia (831) have the highest overall mortality rates across all of the CHNA areas;

- These rates are 42% to 32% higher than for the suburban CHNA area (631).

Heart disease is also the leading cause of death in the West (160) and Northwest Philadelphia (145) CHNA areas. These rates are substantially higher than the HP2020 goal for heart disease of 103 deaths per 100,000 population.

- Prostate cancer is the third and fourth leading cause of death in the West (49) and Northwest Philadelphia (38) CHNA areas, compared to the sixth leading cause of death in the suburban CHNA area (19).
- Mortality rates from stroke and diabetes in the West (52 and 56, respectively) and Northwest Philadelphia (43 and 19, respectively) CHNA area are higher than in the suburban CHNA area (34 and 12).
- Homicide is the sixth leading cause of death in the West Philadelphia CHNA area (24), a rate that is twelve times higher than the homicide rate for the suburban CHNA area (2).

CANCER MORTALITY

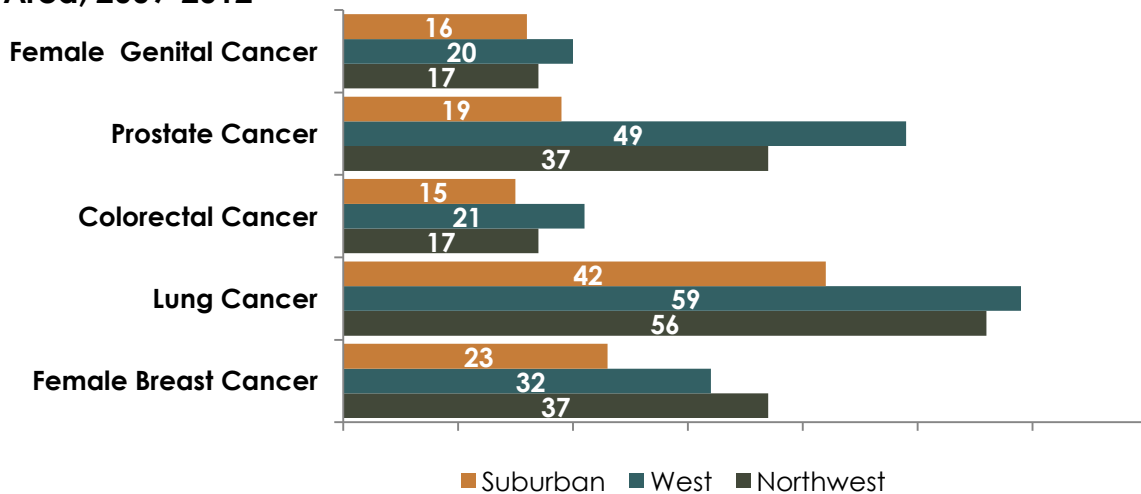
The overall cancer mortality rate in the suburban CHNA area is 160 deaths per 100,000 population (Figure 12). This represents 1,900 deaths annually. This meets the HP2020 goal of 161.4 cancer deaths per 100,000 population.

- Mortality rates for all cancers are higher in the West (218) and Northwest Philadelphia (201) CHNA areas than in the suburban CHNA area (160).

The five highest cancer mortality rates in the suburban CHNA area are for lung (42; representing 500 deaths), female breast (23; 150 deaths), prostate (19; 90 deaths), female genital (16; 100 deaths),¹ and colorectal (15; 175 deaths) cancer.

- Suburban CHNA area mortality rates for female breast cancer (22.5), colorectal cancer (14.8), and female genital cancer (15.5) do not meet the HP 2020 goals
- Prostate and female breast cancer death rates in West (48 and 32) and Northwest Philadelphia (38 and 37) are substantially greater than prostate (19) and breast (23) cancer death rates in the suburban CHNA area.

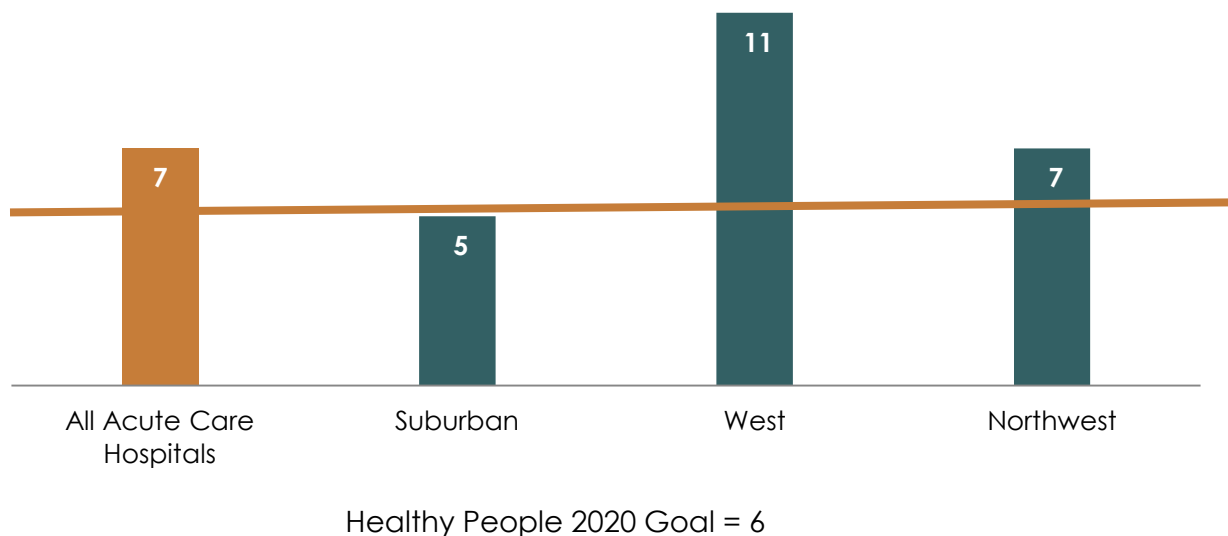

INFANT MORTALITY

Every year, an average of 57 infants living in the suburban CHNA area die before their first birthday. The CHNA area infant mortality rate is 5 infant deaths per 1,000 live births.

- The CHNA area's infant mortality rate (5 per 1,000 live births) meets the HP 2020 target goal of 6 infant deaths per 1,000 live births.
- Black infant mortality rates (12) are more than twice the suburban CHNA area rate (5) and the HP2020 goal of 6.
- West Philadelphia has the highest infant mortality rate among all MLH acute care CHNA areas: 11 deaths per 1,000 live births.
 - The infant mortality rate in Northwest Philadelphia is 7, representing 5 infant deaths annually.

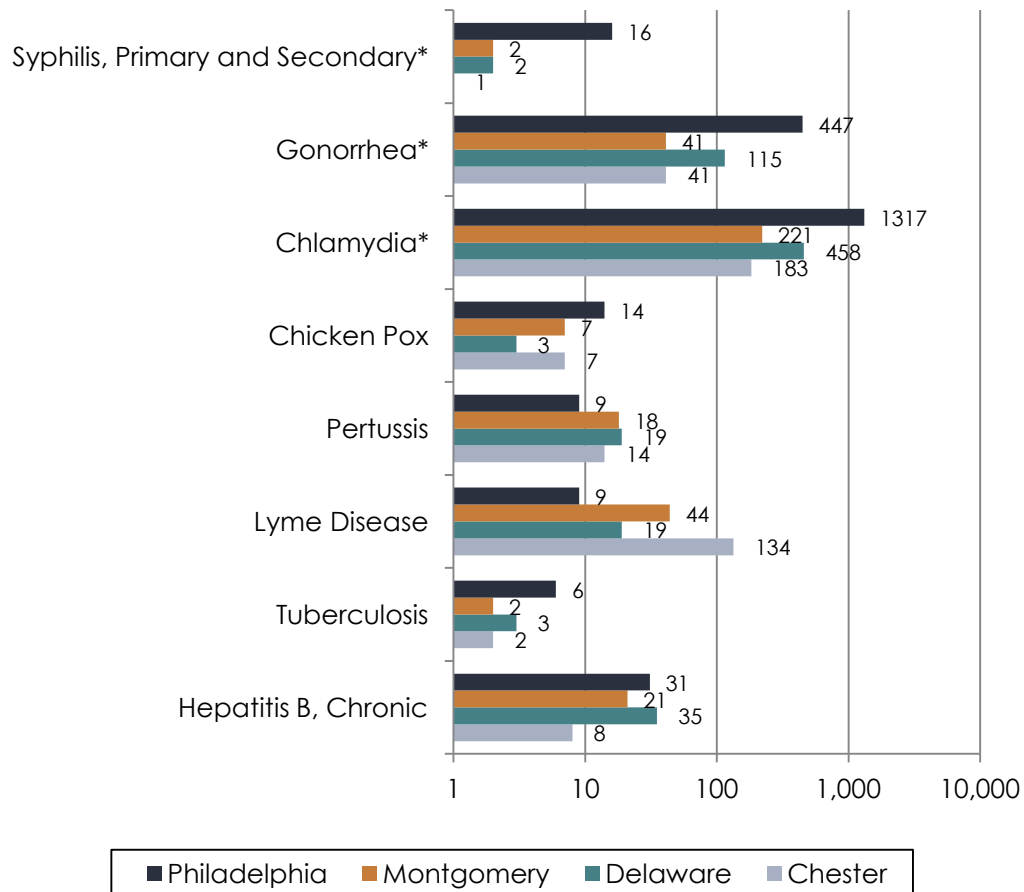
MORBIDITY

Morbidity rates in the CHNA area
are lower than SEPA overall.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

Rates of Lyme Disease and Pertussis are higher in Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties than in Philadelphia (Figure 15).

Figure 15. Communicable Disease Incidence per 100,000, 2013-2014



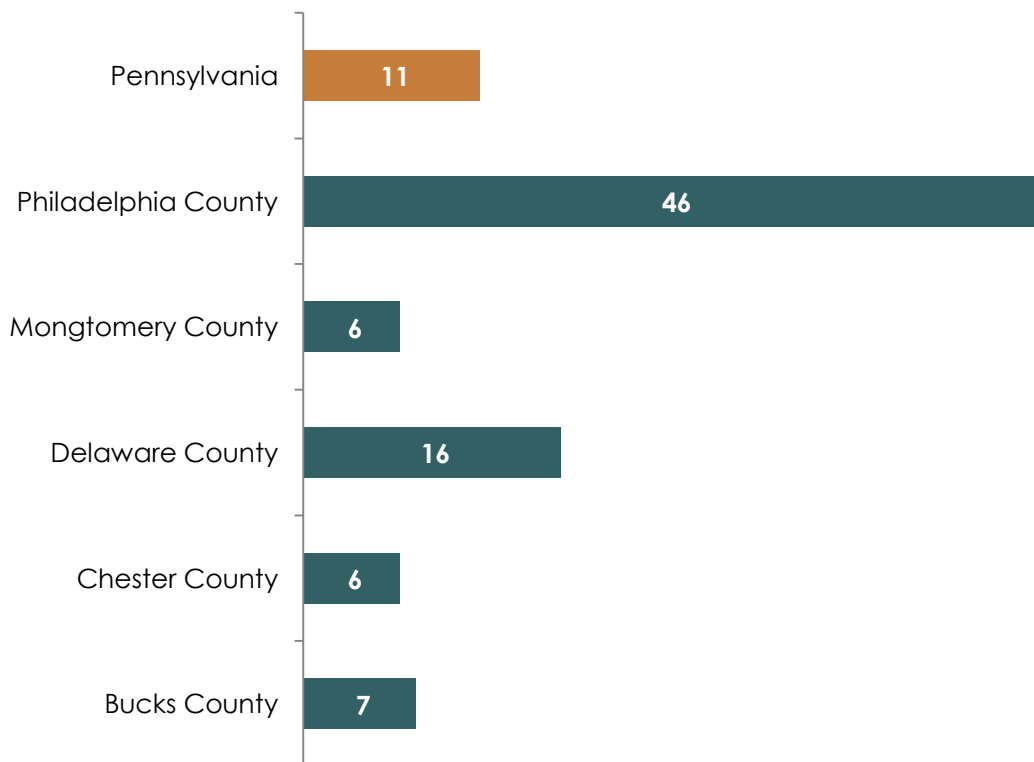

HIV AND AIDS

The prevalence of individuals who are living with HIV or AIDS in Delaware County (16 per 100,000) is almost one-third the rate in Philadelphia County (46). This represents 265 persons in Delaware County and 2,100 persons in Philadelphia (Figure 16).

- HIV/AIDS rates are lower in Bucks (6.5), Chester (5.6), and Montgomery (6.4) Counties than in Philadelphia (45.7) and Delaware (15.8) Counties.

HEALTH STATUS

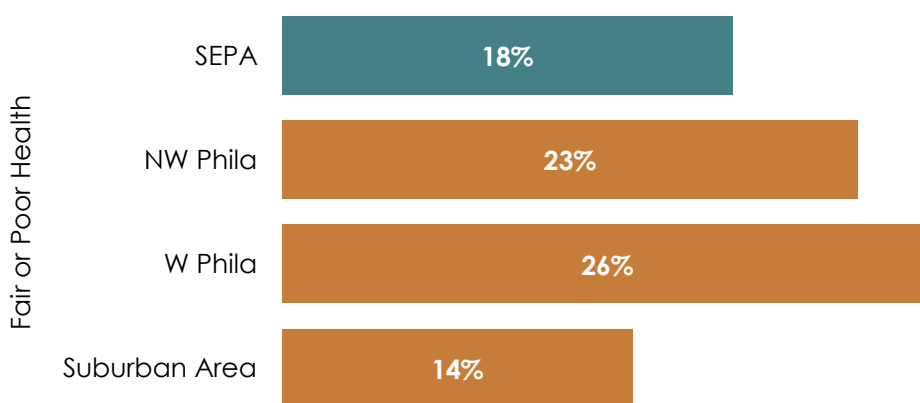
An **overwhelming majority** of adults in the CHNA area describe their health as excellent or very good

SELF-REPORTED HEALTH STATUS

Self-reported health status is one of the best indicators of population health. This measure has consistently shown to correlate very strongly with mortality rates.²

- The majority of suburban CHNA area adults (86%) are in excellent, very good, or good physical health. (See Appendix E for HHS tables). The percentage of suburban CHNA area adults in excellent, very good or good health in 2015 (86%) has decreased slightly steady since 2012 (90%).
 - However, in 2015, 14% (110,900) are in fair or poor health.

According to adults responding to the 2015 Household Health Survey, West Philadelphia adults (26%) are more likely to be in fair or poor health than adults in SEPA or in Northwest Philadelphia (23%) or the suburban area (14%).

Main Line Health physicians were asked to complete a survey in June 2015 on the health of the community and their patients (n=45). Physicians' opinions were that the overall health of the community is excellent or good (80%).

Obesity and diabetes have the greatest impact on the community, according to more than a majority of physicians surveyed (64% and 55%, respectively).

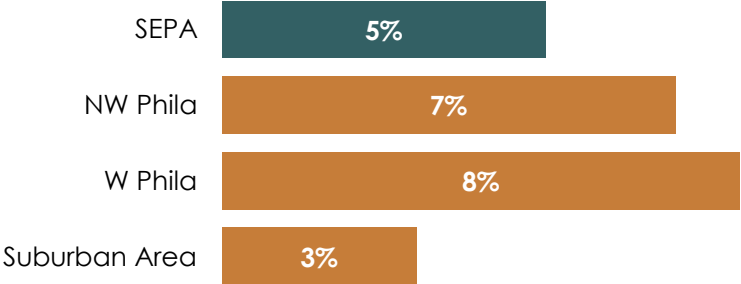

Other illnesses with a high impact, according to the physicians who were surveyed, are heart disease (46%); mental and behavioral health (41%), Alzheimer's disease (39%), and drug and alcohol abuse (39%).

Health needs of seniors were also identified in the survey.

In contrast to adults who responded to the 2015 Household Health Survey, only three percent of children (6,400 children) in the suburban area are in fair or poor health. However, a higher percentage, 7% and 8%, in the Northwest and West Philadelphia areas are in fair or poor health.

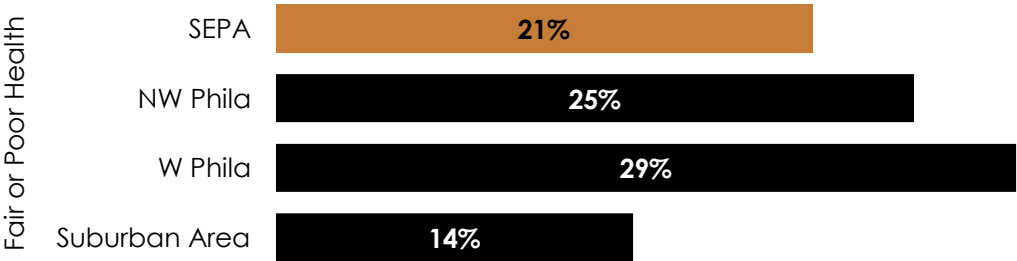
Figure 18. Children 0-17 in Fair or Poor Health by CHNA Areas, 2015

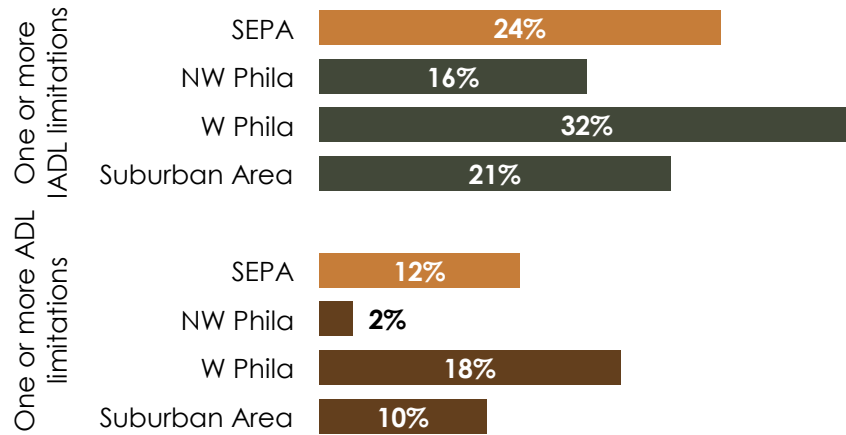
Across the suburban CHNA area, about 32,000 older adults 60+ are in fair or poor health (14%). West Philadelphia (29%) has the highest percentage of older adults in fair or poor health compared to the other CHNA areas.

One in ten older adults, or 23,600 older adults, has at least one limitation in the Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs).

One in five (21%), or 46,900 adults 60+, has at least one limitation in the Activities of Daily Living (ADLs).

Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADLs)

IADLs are activities related to living independently, such as using the telephone, shopping, cleaning, cooking, paying bills, and taking medication

Activities of Daily Living (ADLs)

IADLs are activities related self-care, such as eating, dressing, grooming, walking indoors, bathing, and getting in and out of bed.

SPECIFIC HEALTH CONDITIONS

Community meeting participants in all MLH CHNA areas indicated that the major health problems are: Diabetes, Heart disease, hypertension, mental health issues, a lack of mental health services and dental care, addictions, cancer, and obesity. As stated by one participant:

"Services are needed at every level from inpatient to outpatient to counseling."

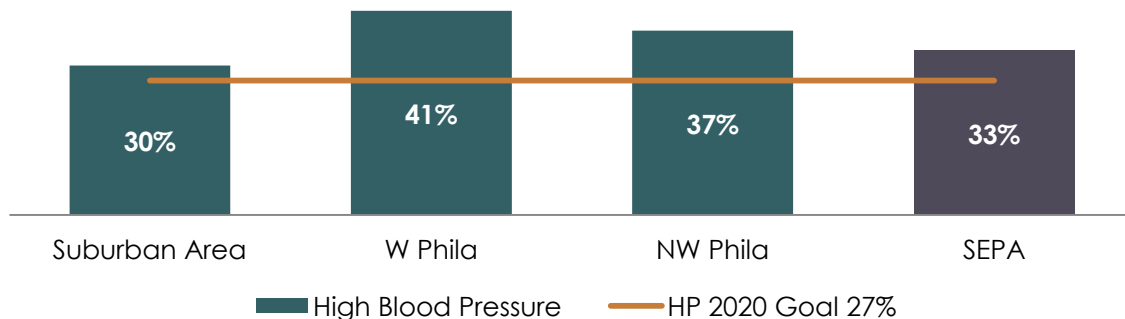
High blood pressure, diabetes, asthma, cancer, and mental health conditions are chronic illnesses that require ongoing care. Similarly, MLH Physicians who were surveyed for this assessment cited obesity (64%); diabetes (55%), heart disease (46%), mental health (41%), Alzheimer's disease (39%), and substance abuse (39%) as the top specific medical issues that had the greatest impact on the population in the CHNA area.

HYPERTENSION

Three in ten suburban CHNA area adults (30%, or 232,800 adults) have been diagnosed with high blood pressure; this percentage is slightly higher than in 2012 (26%).

- This does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 27%.
- Among adults with high blood pressure in the CHNA area, the majority (97%) are taking all or nearly all of their medication all of the time.
- One half (50%) of older adults in the CHNA area have high blood pressure.
- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage (41%) of adults with high blood pressure, followed by Northwest Philadelphia (37%).

Figure 21. High Blood Pressure, Adults 18+, 2015



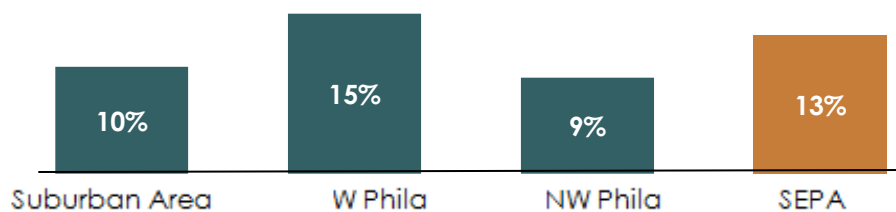

DIABETES

One in ten adults (10%) has been diagnosed with diabetes; this percentage represents 76,800 adults.

- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of adults with diabetes (15%) compared to the other areas.
- 18% of older adults in the CHNA area have diabetes; this percentage represents 41,100 older adults.

Figure 22. Diabetes, Adults 18+ by CHNA Areas , 2015



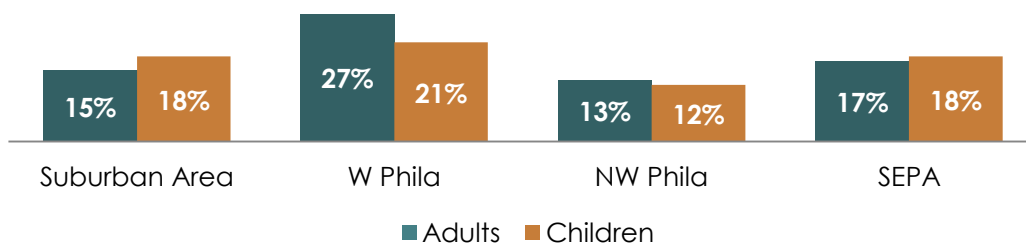

ASTHMA

15% of adults (118,800) and 18% of children in the suburban area have been diagnosed with asthma;

- This represents 40,300 children in the suburban CHNA area with asthma.
- Children in West Philadelphia have the highest rate of asthma – 21% -- compared to the Suburban and Northwest Philadelphia areas.
- According to a survey of 31 K-12 school nurses conducted in June, 2015, the top 5 most important child health issues are: mental health (21.4%), asthma (14.3%), dental health (14.3%), obesity (10.7%), and food allergies (7.1%).

CANCER

The incidence of all cancers in the suburban CHNA area is 496 new cases per 100,000 population. This rate is lower than the rate for Southeastern Pennsylvania (513).

- 5,651 new cases of cancer are reported every year in the suburban CHNA area.
- This includes:
 - 826 new cases of female breast cancer
 - 783 of prostate cancer;
 - 668 of lung cancer;
 - 481 of colorectal cancer; and
 - 338 of female genital cancer.

Cancer Incidence in the Suburban CHNA area:

Prostate: 144 per 100,000

Breast: 136 per 100,000

Lung: 58 per 100,000

Female Genital: 54 per 100,000

Colorectal: 42 per 100,000

Cancer incidence is higher in West and Northwest Philadelphia (535 and 509 per 100,000, respectively) than in the suburban CHNA area (496).

- This represents 1,312 and 269 new cases of cancer every year in West and Northwest Philadelphia.
- The incidence of lung and colorectal cancer is higher in West (81 and 51) and Northwest (77 and 56) Philadelphia than in the suburban CHNA area (58 and 42).
- West Philadelphia has the highest incidence of prostate cancer (205) across all MLH acute care CHNA areas.

Community meeting participants noted that cancer is a major health concern. As stated by one participant:

"There are education issues, people need to stop smoking."

Another participant noted:

"Smoking is a huge industry with lots of political and \$ power. Taxation on tobacco doesn't inhibit anyone."

Finally, one participant said:

"People will buy cigarettes over diapers (also alcohol over diapers)."

Community members also all agreed that there have been improvements in smoking over the past decade and "norms have changed to discourage smoking in indoor locations (including houses and workplaces etc.)" but we still have a long way to go.

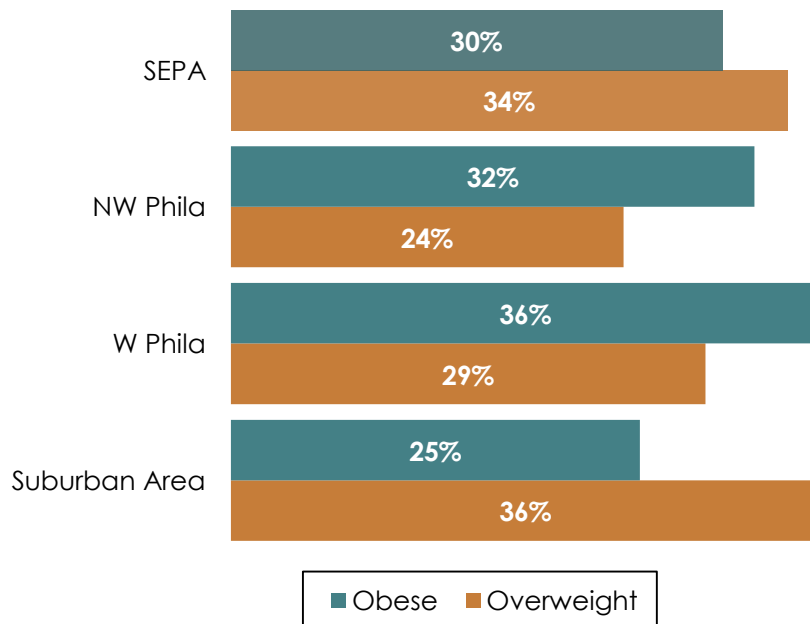
OVERWEIGHT AND OBESITY

Obesity rates in the West (36%) and Northwest Philadelphia (32%) CHNA areas do not meet the HP 2020 goal for adult obesity (30.6%).

Overweight and obesity are strongly correlated with high blood pressure, diabetes, cancer, heart disease, and asthma.

- One-quarter (25%) of suburban CHNA area adults age 20 and over are obese; this percentage is slightly higher (23%) than in 2012.
 - More than one-third of adults in the suburban area (36%) are overweight.
- Rates of adult overweight (36%) and obesity (25%) in the suburban CHNA area do not meet the HP 2020 goal for adult obesity (30.6%).
- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of obese adults (36%) followed by Northwest Philadelphia (32%).

Figure 24. Obese and Overweight Adults (20+), 2014-2015

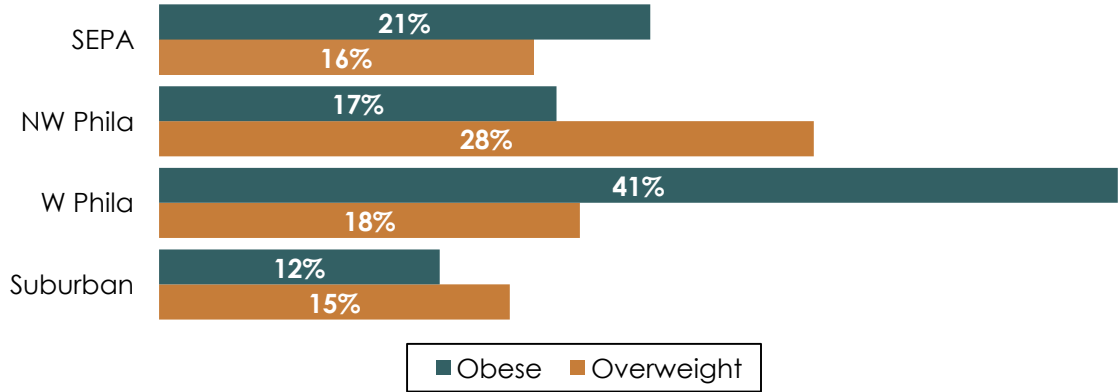

12% of children in the CHNA area are obese, and 15% are overweight.

- This does not meet some of the HP 2020 goals for obesity in children, which are 9.4% for ages 2-5, 15.7% for ages 6-11, and 16.1% for ages 12-19.
- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of children who are obese (41%) compared to the other CHNA areas.

Community meeting participants indicated that obesity is a major health problem in the community. As stated by many participants:

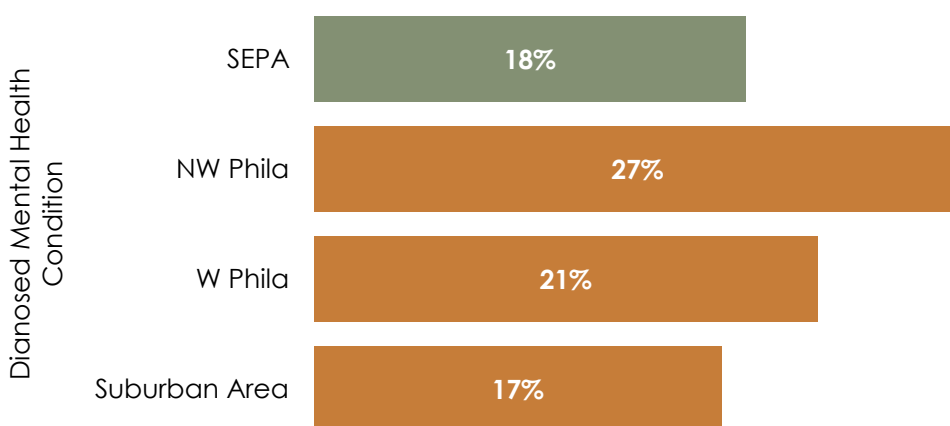
“If people don’t have money they get the cheapest palatable food available.”
“Some people don’t have the knowledge about nutrition and health effects.”
“The catch-22 of the food bank is that there is food but it often has limited nutritional value while having high calories/fat/sugar.”

MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

The majority of adults in the acute care hospitals' suburban CHNA area (82%) are in good mental health. However, according to 75% of MLH physicians (N=45) who were surveyed for this assessment, access to mental health services had the greatest impact on patient quality of life, followed by stress (50%).

Approximately 132,100 adults in the suburban CHNA area, 17%, have been diagnosed with a mental health condition. The percentage of adults with a mental health problem has increased since 2012 from 14%.

Figure 26. Mental Health Status of Adults 18+, 2015



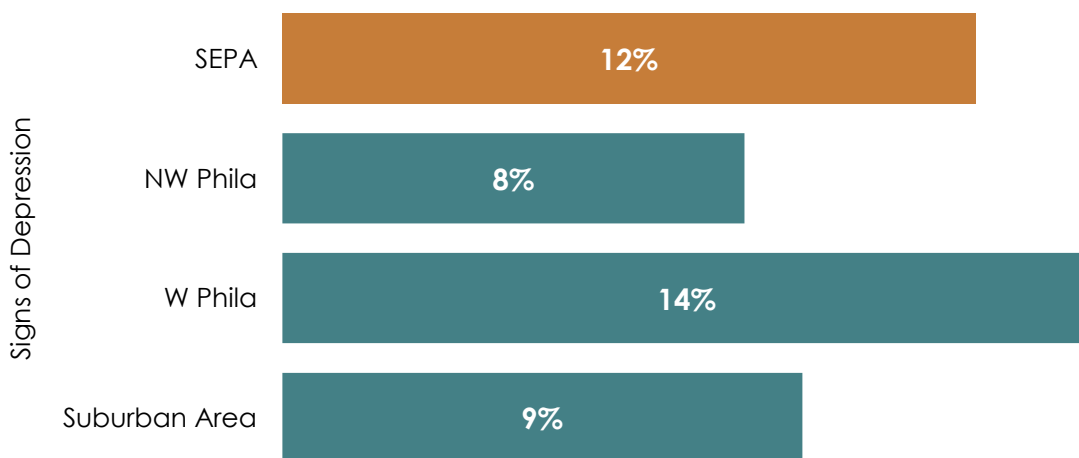

- Of those with a mental health condition, four in ten (40%, or 53,200 adults) are not receiving treatment for the condition.

Northwest Philadelphia has the highest percentage of adults (27%) who have a mental health condition, followed by West Philadelphia (21%).

- A majority of adults in West and Northwest Philadelphia with a mental health condition are not receiving treatment (56% and 66%, respectively); 60% of adults in the suburban area are not receiving treatment.

Older adults are subject to depression as well as those who are younger. One in eleven (9%) older adults in the CHNA area has four or more signs of depression on the CES-D 10-Item Depression Scale.

- This represents 19,700 older adults age 60 and over.

Addiction to illegal drugs or alcohol also negatively affects health, and is present at all socioeconomic levels. Approximately 40,900 adults (6%) in the suburban CHNA area are in recovery for a substance abuse problem.

- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of adults (16%) who are in recovery for a substance abuse problem followed by Northwest Philadelphia (12%).

Participants from the community meetings indicated that there are many barriers to mental health care and that there was stigma around mental health issues. As stated by one respondent:

“The general population needs to understand that they are real and serious conditions, not that you didn’t take care of yourself somehow.” (CC community meeting)

“Mental health conditions can be something that you are, not something that you have.” (CC community meeting.)

The majority of participants in all meetings stated that more/better screenings are needed and that everyone needed to be screened. Participants also stated that it is hard to get people admitted to inpatient care.

Community meeting participants also stated that addictions/substance abuse, including alcohol, heroin and misuse of prescription drugs, is a problem. As stated by community meeting participants:

“Addiction is a huge devastating problem everywhere, including Chester County.”

“Addiction has a profound effect on family and community and Rx opiate painkillers are a serious problem and gateway to heroin.”

“Addiction is linked to other public health problems of crime, murder, accidents.”

ACCESS AND BARRIERS TO CARE

HP 2020 Goals for Access to Care

Increase the proportion of the population with health insurance to **100%**

Reduce the proportion of individuals who are unable to obtain or delay in obtaining necessary medical care, dental care or prescription medicines to **9% overall** (4.2% for medical care, 5% for dental care and 2.8% for prescription medications)

Increase the proportion of persons with a usual primary care provider to **83.9%**.

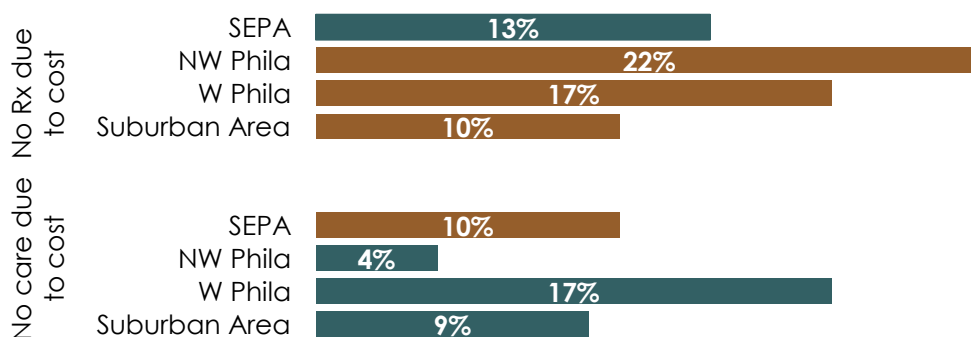
Having a regular source of care, a person residents can go to if they are sick or have a question about their health, is important. People who have a regular source of care are more likely to seek care when they are sick compared with those who do not. This allows people to receive earlier, less expensive treatment, get well sooner, and prevents costly complications and longer illnesses.

ECONOMIC BARRIERS

With or without health insurance, 68,000 adults in the suburban CHNA area were unable to get needed care due to the cost of that care; 9% of adults reported that there was a time in the past year when they needed healthcare, but did not receive it due to the cost.

About 79,000 adults in suburban CHNA area (10%) were prescribed a medication but did not fill the prescription in the past year due to cost.

“A lot of low income folks, especially seniors, are choosing between drugs and food even with insurance.”

Main Line physicians who were surveyed for this report also cited cost as a frequent barrier to health care. Patient sensitivity to the cost of dental and eye care are the two services which cause patients to delay or refuse the service entirely (46% and 39%, respectively).

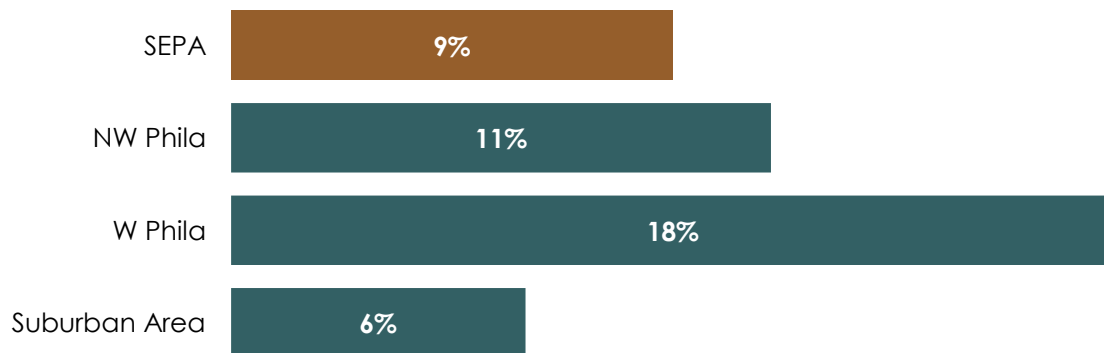

HEALTH INSURANCE STATUS

Having health insurance and a regular place to go when sick are important in ensuring continuity of care over time. The CHNA area does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 100% coverage.

The overwhelming majority of adults (94%) in the suburban CHNA area have health insurance coverage. However, a sizable percentage of adults aged 18-64 do not have any private or public health insurance; 6% of adults aged 18-64 in the CHNA area are uninsured, representing 34,700 uninsured adults.

Figure 29. No Health Insurance, Adults 18-64, 2015

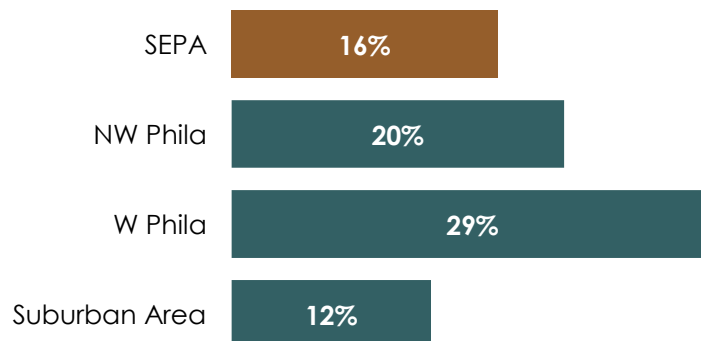

A greater percentage of both Northwest and West Philadelphians are uninsured, with approximately 31,700 uninsured adults in West Philadelphia (18%) and 3,700 additional uninsured adults in Northwest (11%).

About 95,500 adults in the CHNA area (12%) do not have prescription drug coverage.

Among those in the suburban area who shopped the Federal Marketplace for health care insurance, more than one-half (57%) found it difficult to find a plan with an

affordable monthly premium, and 61% indicated that it was difficult to find a plan with co-pays and deductibles they could afford.

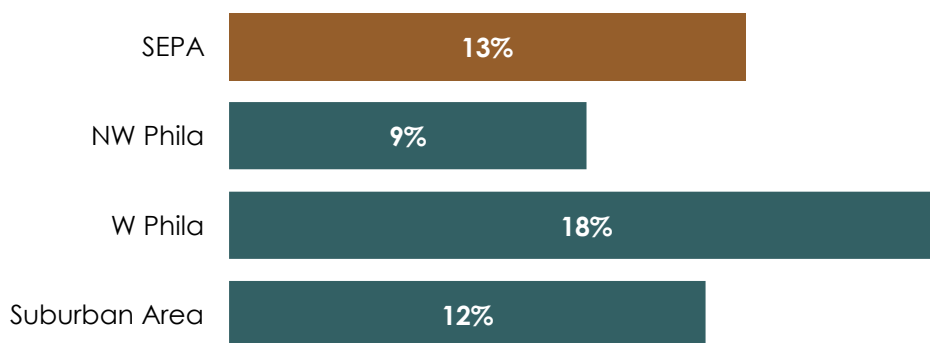
PRIMARY CARE

Having a regular source of primary care is important since people who have a regular source of care are more likely to seek care when they are sick compared with those who do not.

In the suburban CHNA area, 12% of adults (about 91,800 adults) do not have a regular source of primary care they can consult if they are ill or have a question about their health.

- Approximately 6,000 children in the suburban CHNA area do not have a regular source of care.
- In West Philadelphia, 18% of adults have no regular source of care.
- In Northwest Philadelphia, 9% of adults have no regular source of care.

PRE-NATAL CARE

Receiving pre-natal care during the first trimester of pregnancy can help ensure that health concerns are identified and addressed in a timely manner.

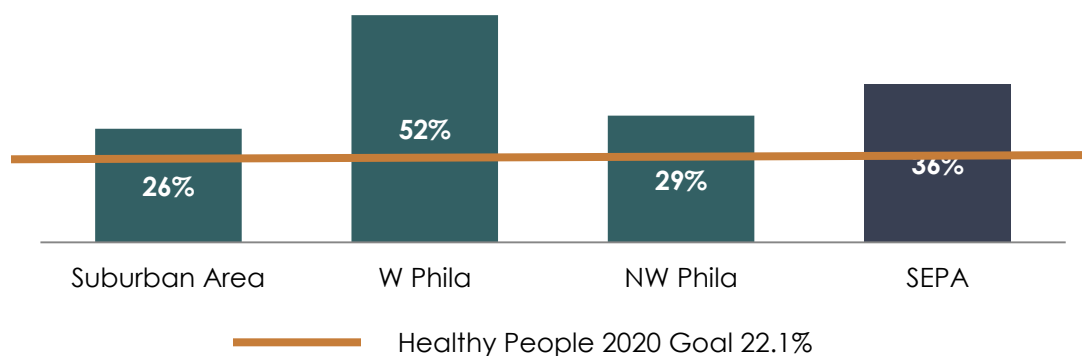
- Nearly three-quarters of women in the suburban CHNA area (74%) receive early pre-natal care, which is defined as initiating prenatal care in the first trimester of pregnancy.
- However, 26% of women in the suburban CHNA area receive prenatal care beginning after the first trimester or have no prenatal care; this does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 22.1%.
 - This represents 2,800 women in the suburban CHNA area who receive late or no prenatal care.
- Black (47%), Latina (42%), and Asian (28%) women in the suburban CHNA area are more likely to receive late or no prenatal care than White women (20%).

West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of women receiving late or no prenatal care among all the MLH acute care CHNA areas:

- More than one-half (52%) of women there do not receive care until after the first trimester.
- This represents 1,900 women in West Philadelphia who receive late or no prenatal care.

Similar to the suburban CHNA area (26%), 29% of women in Northwest Philadelphia receive late or no prenatal care.

Figure 32. Late or No Prenatal Care, 2014-2015

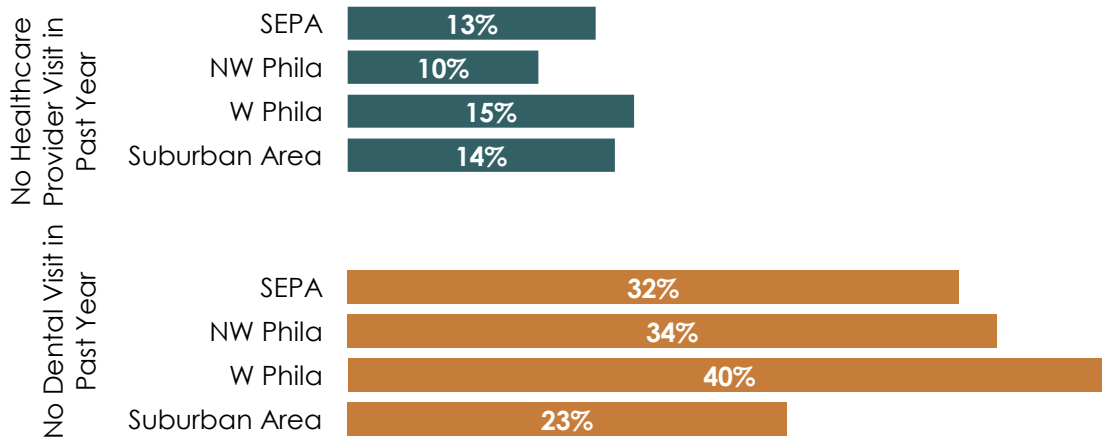

PREVENTIVE CARE

Regular health screenings can help identify health problems before they start. Early detection can improve chances for treatment and cure and help individuals to live longer, healthier lives. In the suburban CHNA area, 14% of adults did not visit a health care provider in the past year; this percentage represents 105,400 adults.

The reasons for non-compliance with screenings vary. Main Line Health physicians who were surveyed for this assessment were most in agreement on barriers to compliance with colonoscopies (dislike prep; 57%) and cardiac screening (do not know the importance; 55%). The top barrier to mammograms and blood tests was lack of time (30% and 41%, respectively).

RECOMMENDED SCREENINGS

DENTAL VISIT

Nearly one-quarter of adults in the suburban area (23% or about 179,800) did not have a dental visit during the past year.

- This percentage is lower than in 2012 (26%).

West Philadelphians and Northwest Philadelphians were less likely to have seen a dentist in the past year, at 40% and 34%, respectively.

About 6,400 children in the suburban CHNA area did not have a dental visit during the past year.

Access to dental care is major issue, especially for seniors or those with intellectual disabilities. And it is not a benefit of Medicare.

High co-pays and deductibles, lack of early dental care for children, lack of education of the importance of dental care, competing needs for the low income population, transportation problems, language and cultural barriers are all barriers to dental care.

BLOOD PRESSURE

About 59,400 adults in the suburban CHNA area (8%) did not have a blood pressure test in the past year. In both Northwest and West Philadelphia, 11.6% of adults did not have a blood pressure screening.

COLONOSCOPY

Regular screenings beginning at age 50 recommended to prevent colorectal cancer.

More than one-quarter of adults 50 years of age and older in the suburban CHNA area (28%) did not have a colonoscopy in the past ten years. Screening rates were slightly higher in both West and Northwest Philadelphia, where 25% of adults were unscreened.

“People aren’t always aware of screenings or the reason to have them.”

PSA OR RECTAL TESTS FOR PROSTATE CANCER

About 91,200 men aged 45 years and over in the suburban CHNA area (41%) did not have a screening for prostate cancer in the past year. The percentage of men who have not been screened in the CHNA area is lower than across SEPA (49%), in West (53%) and in Northwest Philadelphia (57%).

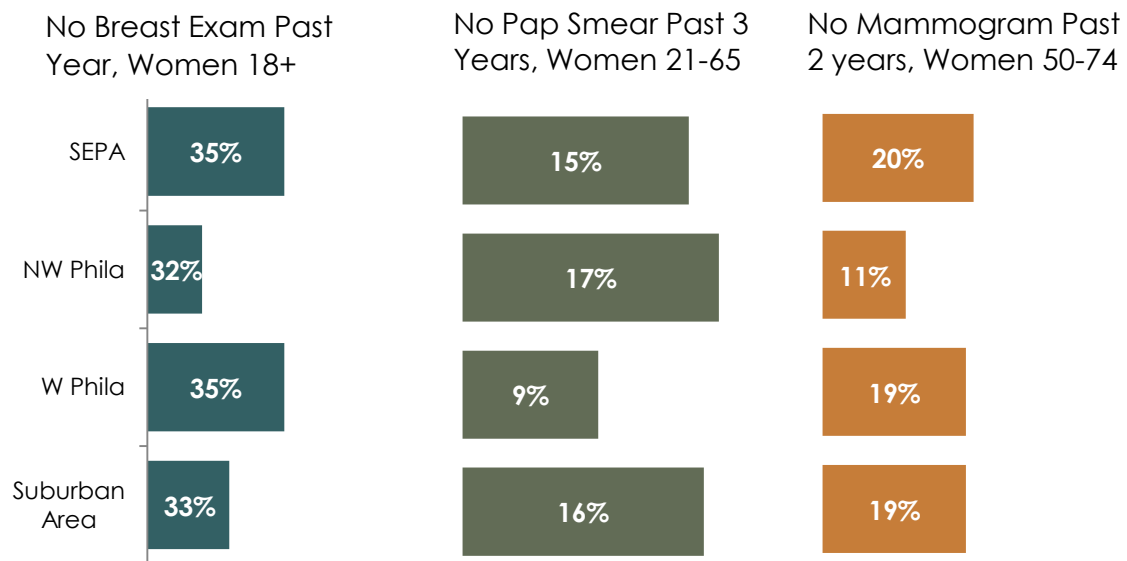
PAP SMEAR TEST

Approximately 48,500 women aged 21 to 65 in the suburban CHNA area (15%) did not receive a Pap smear in the past three years. A greater percentage of women in the suburban area were unscreened than in either West (9%) or Northwest Philadelphia (13%).

MAMMOGRAM

The US Preventive Service Task Force recommends mammograms for women aged 50 to 74. About 39,000 women aged 50-74 in the suburban area did not have a mammogram in the past two years, or 19%. This is comparable to the percentage across Southeastern Pennsylvania.

HEALTH BEHAVIORS

NUTRITION

According to the USDA's MyPlate food guidelines, adults should eat 4-5 servings of fruits and vegetables daily.³

In the suburban CHNA area, nearly three-quarters (73%) of adults do not reach this recommended goal.

- In West Philadelphia, 84% of adults reported eating fewer than four servings of fruits and vegetables each day.

Fast foods are often high in unhealthy calories, saturated fats, sugar, and salt.

- About one in three adults (30% or about 232,900) in the CHNA area reported eating fast food in the past week.

EXERCISE

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' 2008 Physical Activity Guidelines for Americans recommends that adults (ages 18-64) get 2.5 hours of moderate aerobic physical activity each week.⁴

About 144,300 adults in the CHNA area (18.5%) do not participate in any exercise, and nearly half (47%) exercise fewer than three times each week.

- Across SEPA, 22% report not exercising.
- 13% of adults in Northwest Philadelphia and 22% of adults in West Philadelphia do not exercise.

TOBACCO USE

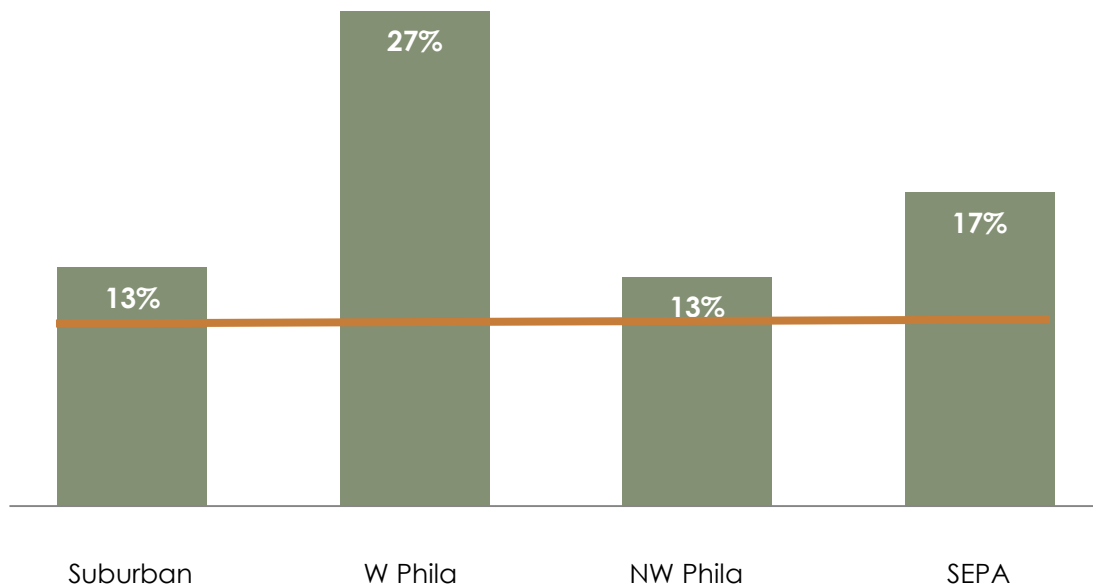
The percentage of adults who smoke in the CHNA area **does not** meet the HP 2020 goal of 12%.

The percentage of smokers who have tried to quit in the past year **does not** meet the HP 2020 goal of 80%.

In the suburban CHNA area, 13% of adults smoke cigarettes. This represents approximately 104,300 adults. This is lower than the percentage across SEPA (17%).

- The percentage of adults who smoke in the CHNA area (16%) does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 12%.⁵
- In West Philadelphia, 27% of adults smoke cigarettes.
- Northwest Philadelphia falls just short of the HP 2020 goal with 13% of adults smoking.

Within the suburban CHNA area, 61% of smokers have tried to quit during the past year.

- This is fairly consistent with West Philadelphia (61%), Northwest Philadelphia (63%) and SEPA (59%), but does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 80% of smokers trying to quit.

Community meeting participants noted described the reduction in tobacco use over the past decade as a “huge improvement, as norms have changed to discourage smoking indoors, but there is still a long way to go.”

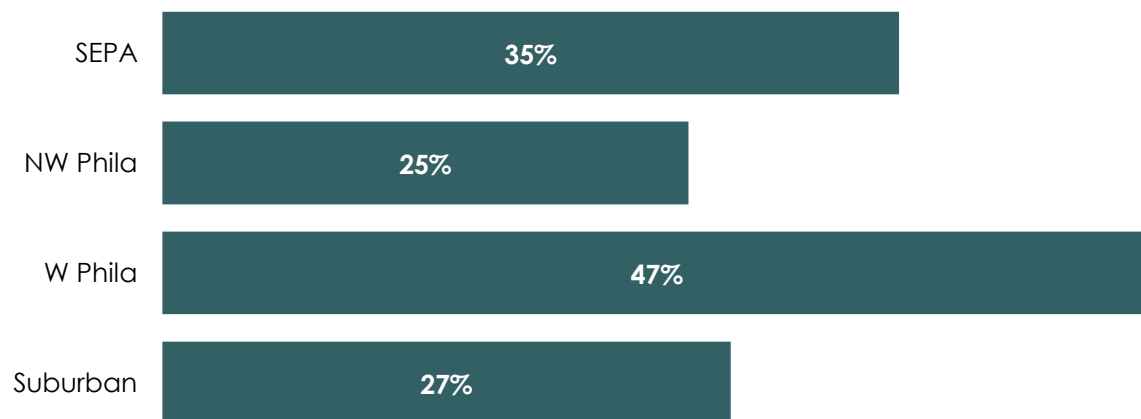
SOCIAL CAPITAL AND NEIGHBORHOODS

Neighborhood factors have important roles in the overall health and well-being of the CHNA area. Social capital is one measure used to understand an individual's neighborhood and role in that neighborhood.

The overwhelming majority (73%) of adults in the suburban CHNA area have high social capital and feel like they belong in their neighborhood;

- However, three in ten (27%) have low social capital.
- West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of adults with low social capital; nearly one half (47%) of residents in West Philadelphia have low social capital.

The survey measured social capital using an index based on three questions: whether people in the neighborhood **work together** to improve it, whether people in the neighborhood **help each other**, and whether the respondent has a **sense of belonging** in the neighborhood.

V. EXISTING HEALTH CARE RESOURCES

The mission of Main Line Health and its hospitals is to provide a comprehensive range of safe, high-quality health services, complemented by related educational and research activities that meet healthcare needs and improve the quality of life in the communities it serves. Data from a previous needs assessment in 2013 identified fourteen priority community health needs:

- Overweight and Obesity;
- Cardiovascular Health / Stroke;
- Cancer;
- Lung disease;
- Senior Health;
- Behavioral Health;
- Injury Prevention;
- Dental Health;
- Asthma;
- Arthritis;
- Cost of Prescriptions;
- Pediatric Care;
- Uninsured; and
- Cultural/Diversity/Disparity of Care.

The current needs assessment, conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, builds upon previously identified unmet health needs using more recent data to review the following health needs and priorities of each community.

Main Line Health hospitals have programs and resources in place that address these identified priorities. For example,

- Health educators provide free nutrition information, health screenings and family wellness activities at local farmer's markets in communities with health needs;
- Primary care counseling and education related to nutrition and weight;
- Free educational seminars for community residents covering topics ranging from healthy lifestyles to joint pain;
- Innovative community events to improve quality of life in cancer patients (i.e., the Free Bra Fitting Clinic to support women who have undergone breast cancer surgery);
- Injury prevention education series for vehicular-, sports-, and health-related injuries;
- *Cruisin' Smart* program that administers a peer-educator to teach students about the dangers of impaired and distracted driving; and
- Diversity and Inclusion Councils in every hospital, along with conducting research on disparities of care and implementing research findings.

The CHNA Area for the MLH area hospitals cover parts of four counties, serving a multitude of diverse populations that experience challenges in staying healthy and finding health care. A common barrier cited among community members is a lack of communication and awareness of the existing resources available to them, as well as the health education to increase appropriate utilization. As such, this report provides additional community assets (Appendix H), comprised of hospitals, health clinics, health centers, community centers and organizations, social services, food distribution sites, pharmacies and nursing homes, to serve as a comprehensive source of programs and services that address existing health priorities as well as the immerging unmet health needs significant to each CHNA area.

VI. UNMET NEEDS

The unmet health care needs for the Main Line Health Acute Care Hospitals' Suburban CHNA area were identified and prioritized by comparing the health status, access to care, health behaviors, and utilization of services for residents of the CHNA area to results for the county and state and the Healthy People 2020 goals for the nation. The current needs assessment, conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, builds upon previously identified unmet health needs using more recent data to review the following health needs and priorities of each community:

- Overweight and Obesity;
- Cardiovascular Health / Stroke;
- Cancer;
- Lung disease;
- Senior Health;
- Behavioral Health;
- Injury Prevention;
- Dental Health;
- Asthma;
- Arthritis;
- Cost of Prescriptions;
- Pediatric Care;
- Uninsured; and
- Cultural/Diversity/Disparity of Care.

In addition, for Household Health Survey measures, tests of significance were conducted to identify and prioritize unmet needs. And, input from the community meeting participants was also used to further identify and prioritize unmet needs, local problems with access to care, and populations with special health care needs. The following are the major findings of this assessment.

In the CHNA area, the overwhelming majority of suburban CHNA area adults (86%) are in excellent, very good, or good physical health. The percentage of suburban CHNA area adults in excellent, very good or good health (86%) has decreased slightly since 2013 (90%). However, 14% (110,900) are in fair or poor health.

- **Heart disease** is the leading cause of death in the suburban CHNA area (108 per 100,000; representing 1,300 deaths annually). This does not meet the HP2020 goal of 103. The other four leading causes of death in the suburban CHNA area are lung cancer (42; representing 500 deaths), stroke (34; 430), accidents (29; 310), and female breast cancer (23; 150).
- Three in ten suburban CHNA area adults (30%, or 232,800 adults) have been diagnosed with **high blood pressure**; this percentage is slightly higher than in 2012 (26%). This does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 27%. Among adults with high blood pressure in the CHNA area, the majority (97%) are taking all or nearly all of

their medication all of the time. One half (50%) of older adults in the CHNA areas⁶ have high blood pressure.

- One in ten (10%) adults has been diagnosed with **diabetes**; this percentage represents 76,800 adults. West Philadelphia has the highest percentage of adults (15%) with diabetes compared to the other areas.
- One-quarter (25%) of suburban CHNA area adults age 20 and over are **obese** and more than one-third of adults in this CHNA are (36%) are **overweight**. Rates of adult overweight and obesity in the CHNA areas do not meet the HP 2020 goal for adult obesity (30.6%).
- Approximately 132,100 adults in the suburban CHNA area, 17%, have been diagnosed with a **mental health** condition. The percentage of adults with a mental health problem has increased since 2012 (14.3%).
- The overwhelming majority of adults (94%) in the suburban CHNA area have **health insurance coverage**. However, a sizable percentage of adults aged 18-64 do not have any private or public health insurance; 6% of adults aged 18-64 in the CHNA area are uninsured, representing 34,700 uninsured adults.

For most of the SEPA Household Health Survey indicators, the findings for the CHNA areas were statistically better than the region as a whole. A few indicators, however, were not statistically better than the region as a whole and could be prioritized for improvement. (See Appendix G for the significance tests on CHDB variables for each of these variables.) These areas are:

- Percentage of adults receiving treatment for a mental health condition;
- Percentage of adults without a regular source of care and access to health insurance, particularly for lower income residents;
- Percentage of adults who exercise regularly; and
- Percentage of female adults who get routine pap tests, breast exams and mammograms and all adults who get preventive colonoscopy/sigmoidoscopy.

Analysis of the quantitative and qualitative data collected shows that the unmet health care needs of the residents of this CHNA area include the following prioritized needs:

- Improved access to mental health care for adults and children, particularly those individuals living in poverty, and who are uninsured or underinsured.
- Access to primary regular health care;
- Routine screenings for children; and
- Routine cancer screenings for adults; in particular, access to women's wellness screenings should be improved.

Priority unmet needs in this area also include increased educational programs to address:

- Heart disease, and cancer management for all residents;

- Access to low cost health insurance; and
- Health education about healthy lifestyles and disease management.

Many of these unmet needs are already being addressed in the CHNA area by the hospitals, other health care providers, government, and local non-profits. The mission of the Main Line Acute Care Hospitals is to provide a comprehensive range of safe, high-quality health services, complemented by related educational and research activities that meet healthcare needs and improve the quality of life in the communities it serves.

MLH hospitals have programs and resources in place that address these identified priorities. These include:

- Health educators provide free nutrition information, health screenings and family wellness activities at local farmer's markets in communities with health needs;
- Primary care counseling and education related to nutrition and weight;
- Injury prevention education series for vehicular-, sports-, and health-related injuries;
- Diversity and Inclusion Councils in every hospital, along with conducting research on disparities of care and implementing the findings.

Some of the unmet needs highlighted in this section are not within the hospital's mission. This list should be used to assist the hospital in addressing needs in their Community Health Implementation Plan.





Community Town Hall Meeting

The topics discussed at the Bryn Mawr Rehabilitation Hospital staff leadership meeting included preventable health conditions and behaviors that lead to hospitalization, barriers to patients getting these conditions addressed earlier, needs of patients and families at discharge from BMRH, barriers to meeting needs at discharge, effectiveness of community events sponsored by BMRH and MLH, and barriers to individuals attending these events.
